Three Simple Rules

There are three simple environmental rules we should try to live by here in Highland Lakes:

- 1. Do No Harm
- 2. Do Good
- 3. Love Nature

We are very fortunate to live in a beautiful natural place in the mountains of densely populated New Jersey. Many of us moved here from the cities and suburbs where we acquired habits not suited to country living in a watershed with fragile lakes. These habits are difficult for us to change. As a former resident of Bergen County, I was not familiar with septic systems, well water, dark and narrow streets, native plants, invasive species, diverse wildlife and insects, etc. Now after living here for 15 years I have become more accustomed to my immediate surroundings, and I have realized that many of my routine actions were not consistent with the three simple rules listed above.

There are many specific things you can do every day to abide by these simply stated rules. Learning more about the specifics is the first step. A few years ago the Club published a booklet entitled, "At the Lake." This publication contains 14 pages of colorful information about our lake environment and the many things you can do to help preserve it. As you read it, please think about whether you are:

Beach Water Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliters. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

Voting Board Approves Consolidated Rules Document with New Tiered Warning/Penalty Assessments

At its May 20, 2022, Voting Board Meeting, the Board approved a tiered system of prescribed penalties for violation of the Club's Rules and Regulations. The existing rules are now consolidated into a single document which includes a process for enforcement, review, and application of penalties, when necessary. This restatement of the rules is meant to ensure that the rules and penalties are readily accessible to members, and to establish a consistent and transparent process of review and enforcement. In nearly every instance, a member can expect to receive one or more notices and an opportunity to respond before any penalty is assessed. Our goal is to ensure that all members remain well informed about Club rules and policies and to promote voluntary compliance without resorting to heavy-handed enforcement. Highland Lakes Wins Third Straight vs. Rival Erskine Lakes

The Highland Lakes Swim Team entered its Week 3 LSC White Division match-up against Erskine Lakes knowing a lot was on the line. With both teams holding unblemished records so far this season, only one team would remain undefeated, standing alone at the top of the White Division by the end of the evening. Inspired by the prior evening's pasta dinner pep rally, the crowds were treated to a first-rate contest between two evenly matched squads. Highland Lakes showed up in force, swimming a total of 85 swimmers in the meet, the largest number of athletes in a Wednesday night dual meet in four years. With a strong line-up, fine-tuned to match-up against Erskine's best, HL looked to exact revenge for the defeat that Erskine dealt them at the end of the 2021 season.

Erskine Lakes started out the contest winning two of the first three heats, and opened up an early 33-15 lead. But Highland Lakes answered by winning all of the remaining breaststroke contests to reverse the early deficit. The 11/12 Girls squad of Adrienn Kovacs, Alicia Kovacs, and Isabella Cherichella turned in a 1-2-3 performance, followed immediately by the 13/14 Boys duo of James Brantner and True DiGuiseppe who took 1-2 in their race. After that race, Highland Lakes pulled into the lead, and never looked back. The Highland Lakes 15/18 unit continued to show why they're one of the best in the league with a 1-2-3 sweep by Michael Puccio, JT Wisniewski, and Colin Dignan and a 1-2-4 performance by Sophia Randazzo, Hannah Wisniewski, and Coach Sofia Staley. At the end of the breaststroke events, the HL lead stood at 93-67.

Highland Lakes butterflyers scrapped for every point against an evenly matched Erskine group. Highland Lakes took narrow wins or draws from the first few contests before one of the races of the evening: the 13/14 Boys butterfly. James Brantner squared off against Nate Schouten from Erskine lakes in a tight wire-to-wire race. Schouten got the win by less than a second, but the crowds enjoyed the race and applause rang out through the bleachers for both swimmers. Brantner would get his revenge in the freestyle, beating Schouten by a similarly narrow margin. The 15/18 squads again showed their class, taking significant victories in both boys and girls butterfly events. By the start of the backstroke events, HL's lead stood at 163-108.

Erskine Lakes made their move in the early events of the backstroke discipline, attempting to mount a comeback, claiming the first four backstroke events in a row, reducing HL's lead to a 35 point gap. But the 11/12 Boys team of Derek Flemming, Vincent Fisher, and Ryan Berutti turned in a 1-2-4 performance to break Erskine's winning run. Highland Lakes won the next 5 contents in backstroke, including 1-2-3 sweeps from the 15/18 boys and girls teams of Puccio, Amato, and Michael Evanick; and Annika Salomonsson, Wisniewski, and Staley. At the end of the backstroke events, HL's lead stood at 253-177.

Erskine again attempted another comeback, mounting four straight wins to start the freestyle events to close the

gap to a 60 point margin. But the 11/12 Boys were once again up to the task of breaking their win streak, with Fisher, Caleb Dalelio, and Berutti turning in a 1-2-4 swim to start HL's own streak of wins. The 11/12 girls squad of Gisselle Bonardi, Juliet Schwarz, Adrienn Kovacs, and Ava Morley threw down a 1-2-3-4 clean sweep to let Erskine know they were well and truly done. Commanding wins from the 13/14s and 15/18s moved Highland Lakes into a commanding 348-241 position at the end of freestyle. With a 100+ point lead, the scoring booth informed Highland Lakes that they would be "unofficial" for the relays, stopping HL from scoring any

Highland Lakes and Erskine split the relay events, each winning four relays. HL relay teams who took the podium include: the 11/12 Boys (Berutti, Dalelio, Fisher, Contreni), the 11/12 Girls (Morley, Kovacs, Bonardi, Cherichella), 13/14 Boys (Bednarick, DiGuiseppe, Allen-Poole, Beninati), and the 15/18 mixed team (Salomonsson, Wisniewski, Cefaloni, and Amato). At the end of the meet, the score stood at HL 348- EL 285.

With the win, Highland Lakes moves into the pole position for the White Division title. The next two weeks will see the team square up against Red Division teams in "cross-over" contests home against Lake Mohawk, and away at Pequannock. That sets the stage for a Week 6 White Division finale against Packanack. If Highland Lakes can claim victory on the road against the Pirates, they'll be crowned division champs! Mark those calendars, we'll need everyone's support to get this title over the line.


Daily Guest Badges


