Swim Team Sinks Pirates, Wins **White Division Title**

The Highland Lakes Swim Team went into the final week of the LSC season with a White Division showdown against the Packanack Lake Pirates representing the final hurdle to clear on the quest for a White Division title. With a lighter squad than usual, HL swimmers needed to bring their best to secure victory. Swimmers were further motivated by the last chance to capture a freshly-revised "A" Time and an invitation to Championships. Despite the diminutive roster, Highland Lakes cruised to a routine victory over Packanack Lake. As one crowd member noted, "It looked like a clear win from the beach!" Indeed, it was. Highland Lakes sprinted to an early lead and never looked back. With a final score of HL 379 - PA 297, the victory was beyond the margin of any potential scoring errors. With the win, Highland Lakes finished 4-0 in the White Division, and 4-2 overall. We're the 2022 LSC White Division Champions!

Highland Lakes breaststrokers set the dominant tone from the start, winning 8 of the 10 contests, exemplified by the 1-2-3 sweep performance by the 11/12 Girls team of Adrienn Kovacs, Alicia Kovacs, and Regina Brantner. That was quickly followed up by the 13/14 Boys team of James Brantner, Sean Allen-Poole, and True DiGuiseppe and their 1-2-4 finish, setting Highland Lakes on course for smooth sailing the rest of the meet. Additional highlights included a last call double "A" time finish by young up-and-comers Ben Fahmy and Luca Berg in the 8&U Boys division. Way to go boys!

Highland Lakes Butterflyers extended the lead taking the majority of the points in all but two contests. Highland Lakes' best performance came from the 1-2 combination of Alexa Fleming and Rebecca Cefaloni in the 9/10 Girls event. Another notable performance came in the 9/10

Packanack managed to slow HL down ever so slightly, holding the team to only 6 wins in 10 through the backstroke events. Notable swims included several 1-3-4 finishes by the 8&U Girls (Anabelle Schwarz, Maeve Olsen, and Avellina Reiser), 11/12 Girls (Juliet Schwarz, Ava Morley, and Adrienn Kovacs), and 15/18 Boys (Michael Puccio, JT Wisniewski, Michael Evanick).

Highland Lakes Freestylers continued to extend the lead, winning all but two of the events. The 13/14 Boys and Girls teams, who have been among the best in the league this season, both delivered 1-2-3 sweeps. The boys team of James Brantner, Nicholas Beninati, and Sean Allen-Poole went first, followed by the girls team of Abbey Amato, Gabriella Cefaloni, and Julie Evanick.

Relay teams split the contests evenly, with both teams taking four events each. Wins from the 9/10 Girls (Zoey Levens, Alexa Fleming, Rebecca Cefaloni, and Delilah Taylor), 11/12 Boys (Braeden Contreni, Logan Cole, Derek Fleming, Caleb Dalelio), 12/12 Girls (Juliet Schwarz, Alicia Kovas,

Regina Brantner, and Ava Morley), and 13/14 Boys (Steven Bednarick, True DiGuiseppe, Sean Allen-Poole, Nicholas Beninati).

After the final relays finished, the crowds anxiously awaited the smoke signals coming from the timing booth as scribes from both teams meticulously calculated the scores. Finally, Highland Lakers were treated to an announcement from the meet MC that the judges had signaled a victory for Highland Lakes! Fans erupted, acknowledging the win and Division Championship, an exciting conclusion to a first-rate dual meet season. Each and every swimmer on the team contributed to the championship this year, securing important points towards team glory along the way. Congratulations to everyone on this exciting win! Thanks especially to my assistant coaches, Catie Lovett and Sofia Staley who have been so thoughtful and deliberate this season, delivering the best possible experience for swimmers all season long. Finally, to the Parent Board and parent volunteers who have worked all year to provide this wonderful experience for our swimmers, thank you! This is a division trophy the whole team can proudly share.





I originally ran for trustee knowing both everything and nothing about Highland Lakes - I grew up here as a summer kid, know all the hidden gems and hiking trails (and the numbers of each beach!) and generations of friends and family, but knew nothing about governance or how the community runs. At the same time as joining the Voting Board, I joined the swim team Parent Board. Eight years later, I'm still on the swim team board, (hopefully) returning to the Voting Board, and have been involved with a slew of activities – you've likely seen my name in the Newsette or my face around helping out with Trunk or Treat/haunted trail, Bunny Breakfast, Clubhouse Breakfasts, swim team, sports, Family Day, Goodwill sale, enjoying our dances and activities, or just paddling around the lake with my family and dogs.

You might remember hearing me say at last year's annual meeting that our lakes and infrastructure should be our priority, and I believe this more now than ever. We are not a zoning board or a health department or any other tax-supported municipal division. We are a Country Club, and we are a Community Association. We are supported by dues, but we run on volunteerism, cooperation, thoughtfulness, and respect. I hope to spend the next few years on the board encouraging us to maintain and improve the things that make Highland Lakes so unique – our lakes, our nature, and our sense of community and volunteerism.



Bob Ulmer, Candidate for Section 7 Trustee

BOB ULMER

I am a full-time resident of Highland Lakes and running for Section 7 Trustee. The following are my concerns:

- Water quality of the five lakes needs to be a priority over all else.
- Related to water quality is the condition of all members' septic systems. This issue must be intelligently dealt with because it is directly related to the quality of the lakes.
- There must be transparency between the Voting Board and the membership. This includes notification of the membership regarding such events as the hiring of tree health contractors, architects and the expenditure of significant sums of money.
- Related to the above is the need for competitive bidding for work related to the Club.
- The ability of the membership to view all Voting Bard and committee meetings through live streaming should be accomplished.
- Training is needed for all individuals who operate boats on Club lakes. This would include proof of such training upon obtaining badges or at the commencement of those renting houses either short or long term.
- Require owners who engage in rentals of any length to have significant liability insurance, including coverage of all watercraft.
- Blast phone calls should be implemented to inform the membership of important events such as the closure of any part of the five lakes.




