The first winter we lived in Highland Lakes, the Main Lake froze solid and clean, with very little snow cover. New friends took us ice fishing, something my husband and children had never done before, and we skated up and down the lake. It was a wonderful day, cold and crisp but sunny, and we had a terrific time with thermoses of hot chocolate to warm the kids and something a little stronger for the adults. We continued skating that winter and for many winters after, often helping to clear and maintain a rink on the beach side of Lake 1. Now, I am more likely to watch the skating as I walk around the lake and worry about the thickness of the ice as others skate, but for those with more energy and ambition there is plenty to do in Highland Lakes in the winter, both indoors and out.

Skating and ice fishing are very popular outdoor activities once the lakes freeze but there's also ice boating for those brave and daring enough to give it a go. It's fun to watch but, wow, do they ever go fast! Sledding is another possibility that happens on many hills throughout the community, especially on the weekends or when school is cancelled for a snow day. There are also hikers and snowshoers in our community who make use of nearby trails. Our annual Winter Carnival is a jam-packed, funfilled day scheduled this year for February 18, which will include a family ice fishing derby, weather permitting. There will be outdoor activities as well as indoor crafts and games.

Rumor has it that pickle ball continues year-round with portable nets on the courts at Glen Wild Way, depending on the weather.

The clubhouse is home to many indoor events during the winter, with activities for adults and children in addition to Board and Committee meetings. A quick look at the calendar shows exercise and yoga classes, games such as darts, chess and bunco, and crafts including stitching and ceramics. There are scout meetings and an Under 5 Playgroup for the kids that occur regularly and special activities such as Kids Ceramics that are one-time events. This year, there is a Cabin Fever Dance scheduled on February 4 for adults, and a Teen Valentine Party on February 12.

Things may have quieted down now that the holidays are over but there is still plenty to do.



No Parking on Roads During Snow and Ice Operations

Please be aware that Rule No. 16 of the Club's Rules and Regulations, adopted April 22, 1994, reads as follows:

Whenever snow has fallen or roads become covered with ice and the accumulation is such that it covers the roadway, an emergency shall exist and no vehicle shall be parked on any roadway or portion thereof. This parking prohibition shall remain in effect after the precipitation has ceased until the roads have been plowed and/or sanded sufficiently and to the extent that parking will not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

Any unattended vehicle in violation of this Rule will be deemed to be parked without the consent of the Club and may be summonsed and towed in accordance with N.J.S.A. 39:4-56.6 and Vernon Township Ordinance 99-12.

Your cooperation is needed to make the winter as easy as possible on your neighbors and the Club. Thank you.

Ash Tree Removal Project Completed

Downes Tree Service has substantially completed the ash tree removal project which involved removal of hundreds of trees located on Club property which were subject to infestation and damage by the Emerald Ash Borer insect. The work began late in the late summer of 2021 but was put on hold after several months due to apparent discrepancies between the contract tree inventory and the trees being removed. The GPS coordinates used in the contract tree inventory were found to be less than ideal for locating individual trees. It also became evident that many trees had been marked for removal by others which were not located on Club property or otherwise not scheduled for removal.

Downes Tree Service cooperated fully with the Club, agreeing to pause the project in order to confirm the location of and mark all trees which were to be removed. This was a very time-consuming but necessary process. Additional trees identified for removal included some potentially hazardous trees of different species and others reported by Club members.

Because of prior contractual commitments by Downes Tree Service, there was a lengthy delay in restarting the tree removal process. The Emerald Ash Borer problem has created extremely high demand for mid and large-sized tree service firms and Downes is no exception. The company has been working non-stop for many months, almost exclusively on large ash tree removal projects for municipalities, public utility companies and private communities.

In recent weeks, Downes was able to restart tree removals in Highland Lakes and the project is now substantially complete. It is possible, perhaps even likely, that a few ash trees have been missed, but unless such trees pose an imminent hazard, they will not be removed at this time. We will periodically reevaluate the need for further tree work and include them as needed.

Finally, we have heard from several members expressing their thanks to the crews from Downes Tree Service for completing the project safely and without incident and for delivering literally tons of firewood logs and wood chips to those members who requested them.

Bunco Fridays






