From the President's Desk

During last week's regular meeting, the Voting Board approved a new Residential Rentals Policy designed to address home rentals as a whole, with an acute focus on short-term rentals, or STRs. This wasn't a sudden decision, or one that we took lightly—it took place after over a year's worth of research and discussion in response to a growing concern held by most board members and a vocal group of members about the threat that STRs and the proliferation of "home sharing" platforms like AirBnB and VRBO, among others, pose to Highland Lakes if left unchecked.

The Voting Board, the Club's legal counsel, and our general manager—both the current one as well as the previous one-thoroughly researched existing case law examples and monitored ongoing battles being waged to contain, control or ban STRs in other municipalities. Month after month we discussed the opportunities and challenges related to wide ranging policy proposals, and debated new ways to enforce our rules and enhance how we monitor rentals in the community. In addition, we sent members a survey to gauge their thoughts and feelings about the issue, and recently held a well attended community discussion dedicated to the STR topic to further understand member concerns from every angle. All of this hard work helped inform the new policy we crafted and approved last week. (We will be sharing very soon via the website and regular mail.)

There was nothing rushed or cavalier about how we arrived at the new policy, and I was frustrated at our meeting to hear a few members suggest that the Voting Board didn't do its homework or listen to members on this issue. I'd suggest that anyone who thinks we are lazy or disinterested should spend more time at board meetings listening, or talking with their trustee, and a lot less time spewing misinformation into an echo chamber.

Voting Board members attend meetings twice monthly at a minimum over the course of three-year terms, and whether you agree with the results of their hard work and voting record they deserve your respect rather than your disdain. They ran for the position and were elected to it, but they are not paid politicians and do not work for you. They commit their time and energy to the betterment of the community because they care enough about it to do so. They work through an endless stream of complex and mundane issues, laboring over tedious details, month after month, year after year, doing their best to keep the community moving forward. And they receive no compensation for it, or any benefit from it, other than knowing that they're contributing in some way to the greater good. If you think they should be doing your bidding because you showed up to yell at a meeting, you're wrong. And if you think you can do a better job, prove ittalk is cheap. Step up.

As with many issues that we face, the Voting Board has

been vocal in recognizing that this new rental policy is not perfect. We chose to pursue policy changes rather than By-Law changes because policies can be revised month after month if need be until we get them right, whereas By-Law changes can only be changed once a year, and with a vote by members at the annual meeting (which is held every August). Having the ability to iterate until we get it right is important, because this issue is nuanced.

If you're wondering why we can't simply eliminate rentals altogether, the fact is that rentals have been a way of life in Highland Lakes since our community was founded in 1936, and are essentially impossible to eliminate because rentals are baked into Highland Lakes' property covenants. Changing those property convenants would require unanimous consent from every member. Anyone who knows how to get 2,000 members to vote unanimously on any topic should give me a call immediately...

The key philosophy here is simple: No member of Highland Lakes wants to live next to a hotel. That's what this new policy is all about—it was designed and written to disincentivize members who see owning a home here as a lucrative business model without making it impossible for members who want to offset carrying costs of home ownership through intermittent renting. It will not appease everyone, and it will only work if we follow up on our enforcement of our rules and ensure that Vernon Township does the same. And even then it will probably need to be adjusted, but it's a strong move forward.

Some will say it's too much, others will say it's not enough, and looking back on it a few years from now I'm sure we'll see how we got it wrong and made it better. Right now, it's a good start. All the while this Voting Board and those that follow it will keep watching the issue and listening to the community, and we'll continue to do what we think is best... because that's what we were elected to do.



Beach Water Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliter. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

Lifeguards Wanted

The following dates in July are the scheduled dates for the 2021 Blended Learning Lifeguarding Certification Class. Blended Learning includes online modules to be completed by the student. Please note that the class costs \$100 due at the start of the first in-person class on July 5. Checks can be made out to HLCC marked attention Water Safety. All classes are mandatory and any class exceeding 4 ½ hours will have a minimum ½ hour lunch break. Students are required to bring an exercise appropriate bathing suit, a notebook and something to write with every day of class. It is recommended that students bring 2 towels, a change of clothes, lunch and snacks, plenty of water and sunblock. Students will be provided with a CPR mask and a textbook. Classes will be held rain or shine, and will meet at the swim lanes at the start of every day unless told otherwise.

Pretest: swim 300 yards continuously using front crawl or breaststroke, tread water for 2 minutes, swim 20 yards and dive to a depth of 7-10 feet to retrieve a 10lb object then exit the water without ladder.

Summer Garbage Pickup

First pickup - Monday, July 5

The Club's summer garbage pickup for ten weeks with Blue Diamond Disposal begins on Monday, July 5. Garbage pickup services continue on Mondays throughout the summer and end on Tuesday, September 7 (due to Labor Day holiday). The schedule is as follows: July 5, 12, 19, 26, August 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30. The last pickup will be Tuesday, September 7. Please remember - your garbage must be out by 6:30 am on collection day.

Household garbage removal services through the Club are limited to one toter (supplied by Waste Management or Blue Diamond to their year-round customers) or the equivalent of three, 32 gallon regular size household garbage cans. Only household refuse will be picked up – no bulky waste, tires, construction debris, etc. and recycling is not provided.

Customers of Blue Diamond or Waste Management will be receiving letters explaining the amount of the credit you are entitled to on your invoice if you have paid your dues and assessments in full before Club services begin on July 5. Please note that both haulers will continue to provide recycling services to you, for which you will be invoiced, during the Club's ten week period of service by Blue Diamond.

Only members in good standing are entitled to credits on their invoice for garbage removal services. In order to ensure that you are provided with garbage service through the Club's contract with Blue Diamond. Customers paying their Club balances after the commencement of services will receive a reduced, prorated credit on their invoices from Blue Diamond or Waste Management.



CCHL is Back



After a year of COVID restrictions and health concerns the Conservation Club of Highland Lakes (CCHL) has gotten back to work this spring with more volunteers. CCHL is a team of "hands-on" men and women who complete projects that improve the environmental quality of our Highland Lakes Club owned properties. We coordinate with the HL Ecology Committee and our HL Maintenance Staff to remove invasive plants, reduce erosion caused by storm water, encourage pollinator species, blaze and build hiking trails, install viewing benches, and many other interesting projects. During the past several weeks we removed weeds, spread mulch and river rock, improved the capture of parking lot runoff, and planted milk weed to host Monarch butterflies at the Club's rain garden. We also cleared the hiking paths at Saw Mill Pond Trail near the dam of the main lake.





How to Claim a Boat/Kayak Rack and Boat Dock Space

Racks:

There are approximately 13 freeways and 2 beaches on the Main Lake that have kayak/boat racks. They are available on a first come/first served basis. Please follow these rules to claim a rack:

1. Any rack with no sticker can be claimed to use for the current year. If, after July 4, a spot with a 2020 sticker is still open, it may be claimed to use for the current year.

2. Do not remove any stickers.

3. Do not chain boats or kayaks to a tree or leave them on the ground.

Docks:

Members who have an assigned dock space at Club Park, Comet Row, Beach 3 and Beach 4 will continue to have those spaces as long as the conditions of the assignment are met, otherwise the assignment will be forfeited. When a space is forfeited, it will be converted to an "OPEN" space, marked by the color tag that appears in this article containing the word "OPEN".

For OPEN spaces on these docks, the approach to getting a dock space is identical to the methods historically used by members – "first come/first served". Once the docks are in place, members may secure one of these OPEN spaces by placing their boat with 2021 boating permits (each side of the bow) and a third 2021 boating permit on the OPEN numbered tag. No space may be claimed without a 2021 boating permit and a boat.

Please note correction: all boat dock spaces at Eckhart Sailing Center, except for those permanently assigned before February 15, 2019, are reserved for active Junior/ Senior sailing fleet members and members with special needs. OPEN dock spaces at Comet Row beginning with an 800 or 900 number are for pontoon boats only.


