# **Annual Meeting This Sunday**

#### Sunday, August 15 – 2 pm

This Sunday at 2 pm we will have our Annual Meeting, intended to provide members with a review of the business that the Club has been involved with since last September including matters of financial and legal importance to our community. Club president, Michael Gelfand, will also share his insights and the membership will have an opportunity to make remarks and ask questions of the board.

This year, in addition to the elections taking place for trustees, the membership will be voting on a proposed change to one of our bylaws. The meeting cannot begin without a quorum of 5% of the membership and in order to vote you must have your membership card (which, by the way, has your section number on it) with you.

Governance of the Club is vested in the five officers and twelve trustees, collectively known as the Voting Board who you will see at the meeting. Each trustee represents one of twelve geographic sections.

All year, these same trustees have been attending monthly board workshops, typically held on the second Wednesday of each month and board meetings which generally occur on the third Friday of the month. While the Annual Meeting offers a great recap of what has occurred this year, Club members wishing to gain first-hand knowledge of the Club's current business, hear committee reports and learn about the issues under discussion should make a point of attending these monthly meetings.

Your trustee is your representative and that's who you should contact during the year if you want to express an opinion about something that is occurring in your section or in the community. Your trustee is then expected to bring this issue before the board at the next meeting. Alternatively, all Club members in good standing may respectfully voice their opinions and share their ideas directly with the full board at the monthly Friday voting board meetings.

Board workshops and meetings follow a standard format. Wednesday night board workshops are where the board fully discusses the issues that will be voted on the following week. During board workshops, only the officers, trustees and Club manager are permitted to join in the discussion. Club members in good standing are permitted to speak at the Friday night board meeting on the topics under discussion before officers and trustees cast their votes. There is an additional open forum at the end of the meeting where matters pertaining to Highland Lakes can be voiced.

While members are encouraged to attend board meetings and express their opinions and share their visions, they should do so with the clear understanding that it is the board that bears the responsibility of deciding what action to take. A decision on a topic raised by a member is rarely made that night. Instead, if the board chooses to pursue the topic, the matter is either added to a future board workshop agenda so that it can be discussed at length by the board or referred to the appropriate committee for investigation and recommendation. Conversely, after hearing a Club member's comments, the board may decide that they do not agree that it is in the Club's interest to pursue the matter further. If that is the case, no further discussion takes place.

The Club's manager is at every board workshop and meeting. In addition to managing the day-to-day operations of the Club, and all of the part-time and full-time staff, the manager is responsible for implementing all of the initiatives and special projects that are authorized by the board.

### **Beach Water Testing Results**

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliters. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.





### **Ecology Corner**

#### **Buttonbush - A Midsummer Favorite**

Growing in the Hudson Highland wetlands, the buttonbush is at home alongside grasses with roots growing in spongy sphagnum moss. It thrives in full to partial sun. This habitat makes this an ideal area for birds to forage for food while providing dense cover making it a suitable nesting habitat for numerous species. I took this photograph crossing the bridge onto Island Road. The buttonbush is growing among milkweed and other low lying bushes.

In its natural environment buttonbush reaches heights of 3-8 feet. This native shrub has distinctive golf ball sized, spherical, white flowers that bloom in mid-July attracting an assortment of pollinators. A closer look at the flower reveals an orb of many long tubed florets with pistils protruding outward like needles in a pin cushion.

Standing in the muck of a swamp among buttonbush is an otherworldly experience with large yellow swallowtails drifting aimlessly from orb to orb. The sweet smelling aroma draws so many bumblebees that the air vibrates with a constant hum. The assortment of bumblebees visiting buttonbush range from large queens that work alongside smaller workers gathering pollen and nectar they return to the colony to feed developing larvae.

Among the frenzy of bumblebee activity smaller bees like green sweat bees and small carpenter bees go unnoticed.





Though the buttonbush flowers attract smaller bees, the flowers are designed to attract larger bees and butterflies. Small bees have shorter tongues and tend to gravitate to the smaller composite flowers like aster and goldenrod. The buttonbush flowers certainly provide copious amounts of nectar and pollen that makes a visit to these flowers worth the effort for smaller bees.

The buttonbush blooms in mid-summer, a time that is often associated with the mid-summer dearth. A dearth can occur if the season has been particularly dry and hot, when flowers that are in bloom produce little to no nectar.

The dearth can occur between the abundance of spring blooming trees and shrubs and before the late summer blossoms of goldenrod and asters. This makes buttonbush a particularly important pollinator plant that should be considered when planting a pollinator garden.



### **Highland Lakes "B" Invitational Returns with Great Success**

After a one year hiatus, the Highland Lakes "B" Invitational swim meet had a highly successful return on Saturday, July 24. Return guests included teams from the Lakeland Swim Conference such as Erskine Lake, Fayson Lakes, Lake Mohawk, Packanack Lake, Pequannock, Wayne Township, and West Milford. Coach Michael Buchney leads the swimmers along with returning assistant Robbie Wisniewski and the new assistant with the team this year, Catie Lovett. They have our Highland Lakes team ready to chase the goals of the day which for the "B" is to try to achieve fast enough swim times to qualify for the league's "A" Championship Meet scheduled for August 14.

While the swimmers get set to do their thing in the swim lanes, the volunteer parents have a big job working to put on the meet and organize the logistics of the day. Volunteer efforts begin weeks in advance from planning concession sales, planning food to cook in the kitchen and at the grill, purchasing supplies, and setting up the facility including the timing system and marshalling areas. The luncheon for officials needs to be planned; this is a unique tradition at Highland Lakes that goes back many years and is well received by all who attend. The Club needs to help with the maintenance staff working hard in the days before roping off space, getting extra garbage cans set, cones laid out to help with parking set-up, and generally lending a hand when needed. Thanks to Club management for also coordinating the one-day parking restrictions at the Clubhouse and with the overflow parking around the Beach Hut circle.

Behind the scenes the meet itself is being put together with entries coming in from across the league. Barry Brantner stepped forward this year to help us get the heats set up and seeded properly in the computer. Linda Allen-Poole then takes the entries and prepares the meet program including a number of advertisements solicited from local businesses. The night before the meet, the Lake Room is prepared for the Coaches Breakfast and Officials Luncheon. The trophies, medals and ribbons are laid out and prepared in the Lake Room as well. The list of pre-meet activities goes on and on...

On the morning of the 24th, activities start bright and early with food cooking in the kitchen and parking attendant volunteers arriving. Swim parent volunteers coordinate additional set-up duties preparing the timing system and scoreboard. The grill gets set up on the lawn for the day with a great backdrop of the lake view behind them. With Louise Staley and Jana Randazzo running the concession sales we are well set to feed a large crowd. Volunteers set up early at the entrances to greet our arriving guests (and collect the entrance fees). The set up of the microphone sound system and starting system is checked. Coaches meet together and put in their scratches and late entries. Our Highland Lakes lifeguards arrive for duty starting at 8 am with swimmer warm ups. Once all the meet entries are final, the heat sheets are printed and the event starts to spring to life. Sara Werner's friendly voice takes the mic and soon enough the meet is underway.

Events move along swiftly throughout the day: Breastroke, Butterfly, Backstroke, and Freestyle. At around the halfway point the grill switches from breakfast to lunch which corresponds to the intermission and luncheon. Concession sales run smoothly throughout the lunch period as hungry swimmers and parents alike grab a bite and take a break. A special recognition is then held for this year's graduating seniors and before you know it, it is back to marshalling the afternoon events and timers and officials head back to the docks to continue the events. The meet finally ends with two heats of relays (unscored, mostly for fun) and by 2 pm our guests are packing up and heading to their cars. On the way out several visitors compliment us for a nice meet and a great day.

Looking back at the lost 2020 year of hosting the "B" there were questions coming into this year about whether Highland Lakes would still remember all the details to pull off a fantastic event. The answer to this was clearly yes! Sure there was a large changeover in the volunteers from two years back as people move or graduate from the program, but the great thing about the "B" is many volunteers come back year after year to help out for the day often long after their kids have moved on from the program. The current parents are grateful for all these volunteers that keep carrying the traditions forward. See you next year.

### Lila Timpson - Candidate for **Trustee – Section 2**


#### LILA TIMPSON


