# Diving Into the Lore of Lake 1

Is Lake 1, home of the popular Beach 1, a natural or man-made lake? At a recent wedding I attended, a group of Highland Laker's were debating this question. While no agreement was reached that night, the question led me on a journey to find out the answer. Like all the lakes in Highland lakes, the research revealed that Lake 1 is indeed a man-made lake. However, it differs from the other four lakes because it was not developed by the founders of Highland Lakes. Lake 1's origin story is a unique tale that takes us back to a time before Highland Lakes existed. The creators of Highland Lakes included John R. Seckler and S. Clayton Shepperd, proprietors of Seckler and Shepperd, Inc., a partnership they formed in 1928

According to local historian Ronald J. Dupont, Seckler was the sales and financial expert while Shepperd was the building aficionado. Their first foray into lake development involved the creation of Lake Wallkill. In 1929, Seckler and Shepperd were brought in by a group of Sussex developers to help complete the project. They did so, and officially opened Lake Wallkill on July 4, 1929. Despite the Great Depression, according to Ron Dupont, Lake Wallkill was a success, and by 1933 Seckler and Shepperd were looking for a place to build a new lake community.

Seckler and Shepperd found the spot for their project at the pinnacle of Breakneck Road. They purchased the first one hundred acres of land including today's Beach 1 area, from Joe Opici, a Paterson businessman, and his business partner, Dick Sauerbutt. In a 1973 interview, John Seckler recalled how sparsely developed the mountain top was when they first saw it. Seckler recounted that only a few houses remained from the old mining days. The terrain of today's Beach 1 was that of "an old overgrown mountain farm," as Ron Dupont describes in his book, Images of America - Vernon Township. As they scouted this tract of land, Seckler and Shepperd noticed a small lake towards the back of the property.

The Opici family built this small, 25-acre lake, that would become our Lake 1, in 1925. It was built with the help of a steam shovel owned and operated by Robert F. Baldwin Sr. of Vernon. Coming from the valley, it was no easy feat to transport the steam shovel up the mountain. In his book, Images of America, Ron Dupont discusses how it took three days to complete the journey with the shovel pulling itself, and sometimes being pushed by the men, up and over the crest of the hill. The picture from Dupont's book shows the steam shovel after it made it to the site of the lake. (insert picture here)

Another historic tidbit comes from Seckler's interview where he shared that the lake was once used to harvest ice before the area had electricity. In fact, many farmers in Vernon used their ponds as a source of ice to preserve milk in their ice houses. Additionally, in his interview, Seckler specifically mentioned how the lake did not hold water well

and how it did not have a sufficient supply of water to keep it full. Seckler and Shepperd repaired the leaks after they purchased the lake and supplemented the sources that fed the lake by rerouting the stream coming from present day Lake 5 under Breakneck Road into the lake. It was a leaky lake no longer!

Lake 1 was the first lake in Highland Lakes, but it would not be alone for long. In 1933, Seckler and Shepperd, together with William Dailey and Clarkson Potter, formed a development corporation called Lake Vernon, Inc. for the purpose of building what is now Highland Lakes. Their initial plan was to call the new community Lake Vernon. In 1935, they changed the name of their company to Highland Lakes, Inc. and the name of the community to Highland Lakes to better reflect the nature of the land on which they were building. After their first one-hundred-acre purchase, Seckler & Shepperd continued acquiring property on the mountain to achieve their dream of creating one of the largest lake communities in Sussex County. But the acquisition of hundreds of additional acres of property and the development of four more lakes is a story (or stories) for another day!

Much thanks to Ron Dupont for his conversation and research about the origins of Highland Lakes. If you're curious about the development of the rest of the lakes, information is available from a number of sources including the Highland Lakes 50th Anniversary Book, Vernon 200 - A Bicentennial History of the Township of Vernon, New Jersey, and Images of America - Vernon Township by Ronald J. Dupont Jr., and in interviews conducted by Dr. Roswell S. Coles, the founder of the Vernon Historical Society. His scrapbooks containing a variety of historical writings are available at the Dorothy Henry Library in Vernon.

# About Changes in your Recorded Deed

In planning changes to your ownership of property that would be reflected in the recorded Deed, contacting the Club Office before you do so for guidance is advisable and will eliminate any misunderstandings.

The Club's By-Laws, in part, define Active Members as those who own property in Highland Lakes. When persons take title to property in Highland Lakes when they do not own other Highland Lakes property at that time, even when they join in the ownership of property with someone who currently owns property in Highland Lakes, they automatically become an active member and are required to pay the Initiation Fee. If you are considering adding anyone to your Deed, a wife, parent, child, friend, etc., please be aware of these By-Law requirements.

Sometimes members form a living or family trust as part of their estate planning. However, even this type of trust is a different, and therefore new, owner of property, and the payment of the Initiation Fee is required.

# **Beach Water Testing Results**

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliters. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

# Call for Nomination of Trustee Candidates

### Filing Deadline - Thursday, July 20, 2023

At this year's Annual Meeting on August 20, 2023, elections will be held for full, three-year terms commencing October 1, 2023, for Trustee positions for Sections 1, 3, 4, and 5. The election of a Trustee for Section 11 will also be held to fill the duration of the term which expires in October 2024.

Candidates for the Board of Trustees shall have been Active Members in good standing for each of the three (3) years immediately preceding the election. Members may nominate themselves or other qualified candidates by filing a nomination in writing with the Chair of the Elections Committee. Nominations may be delivered in person or mailed to the Club at P.O. Box 578, Highland Lakes, NJ 07422. Due to a change in state law, petitions are no longer required for nomination or to run as a candidate for a position on the Voting Board.

All nominations must be received at the Club office not later than Thursday, July 20, 2023.

The Elections Committee Chairperson shall announce the names of the prospective Trustee candidates to the membership by publishing same in the Newsette and by posting them on the Club bulletin board at least seven (7) days prior to the election.

Once the candidates have been certified by the Elections Chairperson, Absentee Ballots will be made available. Absentee Ballots must be received at the Club Office, either by mail or in person no later than Tuesday, August 15, 2023, at 4 pm. The Club is not responsible for lost or misdirected mail.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting on August 20, 2023. If you do not use an Absentee Ballot and plan to vote at the Annual Meeting, please make sure that you attend this meeting and that you have your 2023 Membership Card and badge with you.

# **Promising Start to the 2023 Swim Team Season**

The 2023 Lakeland Swim Conference season kicked off on Wednesday evening, July 5 with an inter-division matchup between the perennial powerhouse Pequannock Piranhas and the Highland Lakes Swim Team. Highland Lakes came prepared for a challenging meet, fielding a lineup with an exciting mix of veteran experience and rookies with raw talent. Ultimately, the Piranhas showcased their strength and depth and reminded the hosts of their status as annual LSC title contenders, departing the mountain with a 342-315 victory.

The meet started off with Highland Lakes jumping out to a strong lead through the breaststroke events. The 8/U Boys team of Cae Laudenberger, Nate Fahmy, and Luca Berg kicked off the contest with a 1, 2, 4 finish, quickly backed up by a 1-2-3 sweep by the 8/U girls team of Maeve Olsen, Anabelle Schwarz, and Junie Beauregard. A few events later, the 11/12 girls team of Adrienn and Alicia Kovacs, and Juliet Schwarz also delivered a 1-2-3 sweep! The senior squads also brought home big points, with Michael Puccio and James Brantner delivering the 1-2 punch for the boys, followed by a historic 1-2-3 finish by the senior girls team of Abbey Amato, Hannah Wisniewski, and Sophia Randazzo.

An exciting note for all Highland Lakes Swim Team history buffs- yet another Swim Team record fell! Abbey Amato took down her second straight Juliann Rienecker 50M Breaststroke record! Having claimed the 13/14 record last year before aging up, Abbey was well-positioned to challenge for the 15/18 50M breaststroke record this year, and wasted no time in doing so, breaking the record in the first meet of the year! The new time stands at 37.64! Congratulations to Abbey who is now featured three times on the team record board! Abbey is a model teammate and works extremely hard all year to turn in these performances. This coach is very proud!!

Now back to the action...The butterfly events saw Pequannock make their move. Highland Lakes took a 13-point lead into the discipline, but conceded a lot of ground over the next few events. Notable performances included young Chace Puccio attempting the event for the first time competitively and taking an impressive first place in the 10&U event! Also a great showing by Alexandra Kovacs, Samantha Werner, and Regina Branter in the 13/14 girls race kept the damage limited, but by the end of the butterfly events, Pequannock pulled into a 9 point lead which they would not conceded.

In the backstroke events, HL got impressive returns from the 9/10 girls team of Zoey Levens, Abigail Klimash, and newcomer Eleanor McCarney who turned in a 1-3-4 victory, which was bolstered by the 13/14 girls team of Kovacs, Gabriella Cefaloni, Jenna Brennan, and Isabella Evicci who ran away with a clean 1-4 sweep! Let's go! Wisniewski, Vanessa Cefaloni, and Julie Evanick capped off the run with a 1-3-4 performance of their own. Highland Lakes Ladies backstrokers represented very well tonight!

Pequannock made a strong sprint for the finish as they rounded the final turn, dominating the freestyle events and seizing the victory. Notable HL results came from the team of Levens, Ceci Laudenberger, and Avellina Reiser in the 9/10 girls freestyle and the 13/14 girls squad of Cefaloni, Brennan and Evicci.

Highland Lakes fielded strong relays, taking 5 of the 7

relay contests on offer, but it was not enough to surmount the deficit Pequannock had developed through the freestyle events. Impressive victories were turned in by the 8/U mixed team of Fahmy, Kutzman, Olsen and Schwarz; 9/10 Boys team of Leiter, Howes, Puccio, and Evanick; 11/12 Boys team of Contreni, Elliott, V. Fisher and D. Fisher; and the 13/14 girls team of Evicci, Werner, Brennan, and Cefaloni. Of note, in the final senior relay match-up the 15/18 team of Puccio, Amato, Wisniewski and Brantner delivered a 2:10.66 performance, the best time in at least a decade, to come within a second and a half of a long standing 1995 record. Will they eventually overcome it? Time will tell. The LSC is on notice, however, the 15/18 unit in HL is a force to be reckoned with!

Special congratulations to the following swimmers who made their Highland Lakes Swim Team debuts: Mia Chonko, Liana Kalucki, Callie Opfer, Eleanor McCarney, Philip Whitby, Marcus Arias, Olivia Kluck, Declan Olds, Aiden Montgomery, Brayden Vradenburg, Hailee Hamilton, Annette Kaicher, Ryleigh Brennan, and Ava Kraus! I wish you all long and decorated careers with the Highland Lakes Swim Team. We've got many more swimmers waiting to make their first appearances soon, with one of the largest rookie classes in recent memory, why not join in the fun-it's not too late! Walk-ons always welcome, we practice each weekday morning at the Clubhouse lanes.




