
Free Shrimp Band Social Distance Concert

Water Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliter. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

Boat Removal Notice from Docks and Racks

JACK MCLAUGHLIN, GENERAL MANAGER

Boats must be removed from all docks and from all racks on the western side of Highland Lakes by Thursday evening, October 15, 2020.

Please take NOTICE that all boats, canoes, kayaks, etc. on all Club docks must be removed by Thursday, October 15, 2020, in order to provide time for the Club's staff to relocate the docks for winter storage. This NOTICE also requires the removal of all boats, canoes, kayaks, etc. stored on the wooden boat racks and on the kayak racks *on the western side* of Highland Lakes by Thursday, October 15, 2020.

In alternating years, once the racks are clear the wooden boat racks on the western side of Highland Lakes are inspected and repairs are made if necessary in the fall and in the early spring. In addition to maintenance and repair, the purpose of this program is to require that all boats, canoes, kayaks, etc. return home in alternate years, ensuring that for the most part the spaces on these racks are actively used by members and not occupied by boats, etc. as simply storage locations.

Part F. of Club Rule No. 25 provides as follows: F. TRANSPORT TO RESIDENCE, REMOVAL TO STORAGE, PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS: Boats, kayaks, windsurfers, etc. of members stored in violation of these Rules which can be identified will be returned to the member's residence. Boats which cannot be identified shall be removed to storage. All boat removals will be subject to a special assessment of \$100.00. A daily storage charge of \$5.00, calculated from the date the boat was removed to storage up to December 15 will be imposed, when a special winter storage fee of \$250.00 will then be imposed. After June 15, a disposal fee of \$250.00 will be imposed. Boats may not be retrieved between December 15 and April 15. The Club may, in its sole discretion, elect to acquire title to any boat that has been determined to be abandoned, in compliance with the "Abandoned Vessels Disposition Law," N.J.S.A. 12:7C-7 et seq.

(Adopted May 16, 2014 / Amended February 15, 2019) The following boat and kayak rack locations on the western side of Highland Lakes are affected by this notice:

Lake 5 - Pocasset Road - Beach 7 area

Lake 1 - Lakeside Drive - Beach 1 area

Main Lake - western shore areas as follows:

Club Park

Comet Row

Eckhart Sailing Center

Crayfish Run Freeway at Winetka Road

Sunrise Path Freeway at Wiscasset Road

Freeway at Oneota Road

Running Brook Freeway at stream crossing south of Oneota Road

<u>Catfish Path</u> Freeway south of Ocala Road Freeway north of Monadnock Road

Freeway at Lakeside Drive East near Main Lake dam

Avoid costly removal and storage assessments – remove your boats from all docks and boat racks as described above by October 15.

Ecology Corner

More About the Emerald Ash Borer or EAB Infestation

Signs of infestation include:

- Bare branches at the top of the tree this may be difficult to see if the tree is very tall
- Considerable woodpecker activity woodpeckers feed on the larvae just under the bark of the tree
- Heavy branching at the bottom of the tree
- The insects leave a D shaped hole in the bark when they emerge in the spring

Once you have determined that you have ash trees on your property have them evaluated by a certified tree company. Once dead trees become very brittle and cannot be climbed. The tree can be dead within three years. All of our ash trees, if left untreated will eventually become infected. In order to save healthy ash trees it is appropriate to begin treatment now.

Treatment options include:

- Soil-applied systemic insecticides
- Trunk-injected systemic insecticides
- Non-invasive systemic basal trunk sprays
- Protective cover sprays

Any trees determined to be a high safety risk should be removed immediately. Actively infested trees should be cut down and chipped as soon as possible. For all other ash, it is best to complete removals in the fall or winter. The material must be processed (chipped or de-barked) before emergence (by late April).

It is important to have your trees treated by a certified tree company licensed to apply the chemicals used in treatment. This is not a home gardener's project. Here is a link to an informative video: https://www.state.nj.us/dep/parksandforests/eab_video.mp4



Beach Rules

Everyone's Safety Matters

Beach rules have been adopted for everyone's safety and comfort. Failure to obey posted rules will result in expulsion from the beach and/or other disciplinary action.

- Swimming is permitted ONLY when a lifeguard is on duty, within the roped-in areas, and is done at the swimmer's own risk.
- Lifeguards supervise the roped-in areas only.
- Directives from lifeguards must be followed at all times.
- Flotation devices may only be used where the user can stand.
- An adult must accompany children requiring supervision.
- Swimmers must enter and leave the swimming area via the beach.
- Swimming is prohibited when thunder or lightning is present.
- Roughness, rowdiness, spitting, foul language, littering or other conduct affecting the safety and/or comfort of others is prohibited.
- Alcohol, glass containers, and pets (with the exception of dogs used for medical/physical assistance) are not permitted on the beach at any time.
- New Jersey's bathing beach regulations require that all children in diapers must wear plastic pants with snug fitting elastic waist and leg bands. Acceptable disposable swim pants are now available in the diaper aisle in grocery stores. Do not wash out soiled diapers in the bathing water.
- All boats must stay clear of the swimming areas. Boats may not drop-off or pick-up swimmers from within the roped swimming areas.
- Fishing is prohibited within designated areas at all beaches.
- In the interest of the safety of all members using our beaches, please be advised that grills are allowed ONLY on Beaches 3 and 5 and ONLY in the grassy area where the picnic tables are, away from the beach patrons, lifeguard equipment and any playground equipment. Your cooperation is appreciated.
- Smoking, vaping or the use of tobacco products is prohibited at all times on all Club properties, including Club beaches and parking lots.
