## **Annual Meeting Review**

It was a beautiful afternoon on the front lawn of the Clubhouse as the mandatory quorum of at least five percent of the membership was confirmed, and Voting Board President Ray Zimmerman called the Annual Meeting to order. His year-in-review included news of how well our lakes have been responding to the treatments received this summer. He proudly stated, "Lake 4 has been open all summer, a success that had not been achieved in over two years, and the Main Lake is looking much better than it did last year at this time." He went on to warn members, however, that the fight was not over. "If we do nothing more, we'll be back to where we were two years ago faster than you think."

There can be no denying that our lakes are this community's finest assets, Ray insisted. Then he went on to explain that the report that was received from Princeton Hydro and substantiated by another professional team left no doubt that our individual septic systems are the leading culprit when it comes to poor conditions. That finding is what led the Board to enact a rule requiring mandatory pumping of septic systems every three years, a regulation that will benefit the health of our lakes and extend the life of individual septic systems as well.

The Board also passed a rule which requires members to notify the Club and receive its permission prior to cutting any healthy tree that is larger than four inches in diameter. This rule has come about because of the significant removal of healthy trees on certain properties, Ray explained. He cautioned that the clear-cutting of trees leads to excessive storm water run-off, which also diminishes the quality of our waterways. He stated that fines for this offense are intentionally high for that reason. Members are strongly encouraged to contact the Club before removing healthy trees from their property.

Other successes were shared in Ray's opening remarks. Family Day was well attended, and the fireworks were great, as always. We have 100 swimmers on our swim team and 92 seniors actively participating in our Senior Club. At our Adult Appreciation night, over 200 members were recognized for their volunteer efforts that make Highland Lakes an outstanding community. More docks were added to Comet Row (near Beach 2) this year, and the extensive work on Shadow Lane paving, stormwater, and freeway has been completed.

The meeting was then handed over to Treasurer Lou Iannucci, who stated that significant funds had been saved this year thanks to the efforts of management and that the Board is now working on the new budget. This process began at the August 16 Workshop meeting, which can be viewed online in the "Documents" section of the member portal. Chairman of the Board, Lyle Timpson, then addressed the membership, focusing on lake quality and the work that this Board and the prior Board had done to


address the issues cited by lake management professionals. She insisted that it is the responsibility of the Board to do what is best for the entire community, and that is why septic pumping mandates were put in place.

The membership then heard from Michelle Corbett-Rivielle, an attorney from Dolan and Dolan, the law firm that has represented our community for twenty years now, and then from approximately twenty members who shared their concerns, comments, and appreciation for all of the Board's efforts. Voting for section trustees followed these comments. Results of the election can be found elsewhere in this Newsette.

While the Club does publish and post, there is nothing like attending meetings in person if you wish to be informed and engaged. Our Annual Meeting is held on the third Sunday in August, but regular Board meetings and workshops occur monthly on the second Wednesday and third Friday with few exceptions. All members in good standing are welcome to attend.

Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

### Beach 1 Bus Stop Information

Thursday, September 7, marks the opening of school and the school bus stop at Beach 1. On Wednesday evening, September 6, the parking and traffic pattern at Beach 1 will be changed to accommodate school buses and to bar access to parking aisles from the Breakneck Road entrance. This change will be in effect until the end of the school year next June.

Please remember:

Parking for those who enter the Beach 1 site from Breakneck Road will be restricted to the parking spaces in the "loop road" – there will be no access into either of the two parking aisles along the ball field or children's playground area.

Stopping/Standing is prohibited at all times within the school bus loop road.

Access into both parking aisles will be available from the rear of the site – the Lakeside Drive entrance. You will be able to pass from one aisle to the other in the area at the loop road and at the rear of the site.

Designated handicapped parking spaces are restricted under all circumstances to those drivers authorized to use them – the Vernon Police will issue summonses for unauthorized use.

Parents are reminded that the tennis courts are for tennis only – children are not permitted to play in these areas at any time.

Parents who live north of Breakneck Road should use the Lakeside Drive entrance, leaving the spaces in the loop road available to others. Your cooperation is essential in making the school bus stop safe for all children and the drivers of the school buses. Thank you.

#### **Top 10 Lake Water Quality Dos and Don'ts**

This is the final article in our series outlining key learnings from Lake Appreciation Day. It is simply our Top 10 List. Thanks for participating. Enjoy.

- 1. DO pump your septic every three years, inspect regularly
- 2. DO reduce lawn footprint with plantings, minimize fertilizer and weed killer
- 3. DO divert gutters and runoff from direct entry into lake, preferably into plantings
- 4. DO minimize impervious surfaces: gravel vs. asphalt and porous pavers vs concrete
- 5. DON'T blow or rake leaves or other debris into the lake. DON'T put in empty lots

- 6. DON'T put anything into the storm drains as they all eventually lead to the lake
- 7. DO pickup and properly discard of pet waste
- 8. DO only put the 3 Ps into toilet (pee, poop, paper)9. DO only allow cleaner water down the sink (strain food, no grease, no chemicals)

### Undertaking A Home Improvement Project Construction (part 5 of 6)

Prior to commencing work, reconfirm the timing and budget with all parties. Have a schedule, identify the order items are to be undertaken, when decisions and inspections are required, and when payments are due.

Work in Highland Lakes can be completed throughout the year. Contractors may be more readily available in the so called 'off season.' Weather can be harsh on the mountain; snow and rain can slow or stop a project and/or cause additional costs.

Don't stand in the way of progress. If you are providing materials, make sure they are on-site when needed – not early or late. Some items may have a long lead time (windows, cabinets, hardware); make sure they are ordered so you don't delay progress. And if you are responsible for preparation, such as moving furniture or demolition, make sure your work is completed when promised.

If you are the GC, know when permit inspections are required, (footings, sheathing, plumbing, electric, mechanical, framing, insulation, fire protection, and final). Missing an inspection can result in work being slowed or worse, requiring walls to be reopened for inspection, rebuilding work, or replacement of equipment.




### **Spotlight on Rules**

#### ATVs

Per ARTICLE III. - VEHICLES, ROADS & RIGHTS-OF-WAY C - Permitted Vehicles - Only those motor vehicles which are legally equipped, registered, insured, and approved for regular use on public roadways in accordance with NJ Title 39 may be operated on Club private roadways. Notwithstanding the foregoing, all motorized vehicles of any type which are designed and manufactured primarily for off-road use are expressly prohibited from operating on Club private roadways.
