

## A Solution to a Silent Killer and Maimer of Wild Life

One of the most dangerous substances found in the waters of Highland Lakes is discarded monofilament fishing line. This line is deadly to our osprey, eagles, cormorants and other birds, turtles, frogs, and fish. Entanglements can lead to injury, drowning, strangulation, and starvation. Death can also result from ingestion. What makes monofilament line especially insidious is that it takes 600 years to decompose.

A simple solution to alleviate the problem for fishermen is to use an empty tennis ball can with cap to store discarded monofilament line. That includes short pieces cut off when tying knots or attaching lures and damaged or knotted line that is pulled off a reel. When fishing, one should make sure to leave a minimum amount of line with a snagged lure or hook. The excess goes in the can. An empty tennis ball can and small scissors are items every environmentally conscious member of Highland Lakes should consider having in his/her boat, canoe, or kayak. Whenever you see a tangle of monofilament line in a tree, bush, or snagged on a log, remove it and place it in your tennis ball can. We all need to be "Stewards of Nature".

At the end of the day you can dispose of your clean line (no hooks, lures, weights, etc.) in the "Fishing Line Disposal Receptacles". They are located near the boat ramp next to Beach 2, near the docks on the side of the Clubhouse, at Comet Row, and at the freeways next to Beach 3 and Beach 7. If you wish to dispose of the line yourself, cut it into lengths six inches or less. Place it in a sealed paper bag, and put it in with your garbage. Highland Lakes wildlife will thank you. Empty tennis ball cans are available at the Activity Center in the Clubhouse.



In these parts, we call that board dancing. Not only are the winds shifty, puffy and gusty in these conditions but it will also seem as though someone is controlling a switch to turn the wind on at 25 mph and then off to zero. That's when we're left hooked in and then left out to dry.

The merciless conditions hammered, pummeled and threw us around like rag dolls to the point where we finally had to throw in the towel and call it a day after just one race. Sometimes it's not nice to fool with Mother Nature. I do, however, commend Chip for coming out in these conditions while feeling under the weather. I call that bravery, tenacity, competitiveness, and for lack of a better word - foolishness. In any case, this guy is a real trooper. Here's hoping for a 15 mph wind forecast with the word south in it.
