From the President's Desk

SUE ROSS, PRESIDENT

I'm happy to report that projects approved by the Voting Board months ago are moving along smoothly. The air conditioning system will be fully installed and completed by mid-March. Permits needed for repairs to the Beach Hut at Beach 1 have been approved by the Vernon Township Building Department; work will begin this spring and is planned to be completed by Memorial Day weekend. Inspections of tennis courts and utility courts are underway by potential contractors, and discussions are underway with Boswell Engineering for consultation services in the evaluation of competing proposals for this project should the Voting Board decide to move ahead.

At the Voting Board's February Workshop, scheduled for February 6 at 8 pm, we will be discussing the abandonment of assigning permanent boat docks and reconsidering how we manage the boats that are not removed from docks and

racks in a timely fashion. I expect that we will be voting on these changes at the Friday Voting Board meeting on February 15 at 8 pm. If these issues are of interest to you, I recommend you attend both of these meetings. While you are not permitted to comment at the workshop, you will hear the discussion that will lead to the informed vote at the Friday night meeting. At the Voting Board meeting on the 15th, you will have the opportunity to share your opinion prior to any vote being taken.

Please be sure to open and read the Goodwill Fund flyer which was included in your 2019 invoice at the end of January. If you have a friend or neighbor in Highland Lakes who has experienced a catastrophic event and is in need of financial assistance in maintaining their Club membership in good standing, reach out to them and encourage them to make a confidential application.

Keep our Storm drains cleared of leaves and other debris

If you have storm drains in front of your property make sure to keep them free of accumulated debris. This will ensure the water runs off rather than ponding on the roadways as well as keeping the debris from running into the streams and lakes. Clearing snow and ice away from drains also helps considerably.

The following photos are of one of the drains in front of my house before and after. This might involve cleaning up piles of leaves that have accumulated in the street surrounding the drain.



Reasons to Plant a Tree This Spring:

- Planting a tree is one of the easiest and most powerful things that an individual can do to have a positive impact on the environment. Trees clean the air, prevent rainwater runoff, help save energy and even combat global warming. And, they are a snap to plant - no horticultural degree required.
- Trees fight climate change. Through photosynthesis, trees absorb harmful carbon dioxide, removing and storing the carbon and releasing oxygen back into the air.
- Trees clean the air and help people

breathe. Trees don’t just absorb CO2. They also absorb odors and pollutants such as nitrogen oxides, ammonia, sulfur dioxide and ozone. It is estimated that one tree can absorb nearly 10 pounds of polluted air each year and release 260 pounds of oxygen.

- Trees prevent soil erosion and rainwater runoff. Leaf canopies help buffer the falling rain and their roots hold the soil in place, encouraging the water to seep into the ground rather than run off.
- Planting a tree is easy. Choose a tree that is hardy to our growing zone and native to our area.
- Trees attract birds. Trees provide nesting sites, food and shelter for birds.
- Trees can live hundreds of years, so when one is planted it is a gift to the next generation and the generation after that.
