From the President's Desk

The Voting Board met on Friday, March 15 for a two-in-one evening, a Workshop which was immediately followed by a Voting Board meeting. Although the agenda was filled, we were able to make decisions on a variety of topics and moved projects forward accordingly.

Items approved included the following:

- Authorization to designate certain boat dock spaces for the use of persons with a disability, provided sufficient proof is filed with the Club office.
- Acceptance of the Goodwill Fundraising Committee's recommendations regarding eligibility criteria when determining the awarding of Goodwill Funds.
- Acceptance of a proposal from United Construction Services for road sweeping. This job takes about ten days to perform and typically begins at the end of this month when snow season is behind us.

- Appropriations in the Capital Fund to purchase dock extensions to existing docks and additional kayak racks. In-lake EZ Dock easy-access units that will make it easier for kayakers to get in and out of their boats were also approved, subject to placement decision by the Boat Dock committee.

- Adoption of the FY 2019 Capital Fund budget as submitted by the Administration Committee.

In other news, the final tests are being conducted on our new air conditioning and heating units. I think it is safe to say that you can anticipate enjoying Clubhouse events this summer without wilting. Voting Board members received a copy of Princeton Hydro's Watershed Assessment of the Lagoon last month and will be holding discussions at upcoming Voting Board Workshops regarding any future actions to be taken. Many members have been involved in

the production of a journal which is soon to be published and distributed to all. I'm hopeful that it will be ready when you go to pick up this season's badges.

A sincere thanks to everyone who had a part in the journal and Special, Special Thanks to Tom Dolle, chairperson of the Communications Committee. The journal is Tom's brainchild and you will see his professional designer's touch on every single page. Tom has been amazingly generous with his time and talents as he saw this project through from inception to completion. The publication captures the magic and beauty of our community as well as offering essential tips on clean living in a country setting. It is another fine example of the good that comes from open-hearted collaboration. I know I have said it before, but I just have to say it again: I love this place!

The Club will be offering a Boating Safety Course taught by the Coast Guard in the Lake Room on Sunday, July 13, 2019. The course will run from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Anyone interested in taking this course must sign up in advance with the Club Office by July 1, 2019. Please bring \$50.00 CASH (exact change preferred) the day of for the cost of the course.

There will be a test at the end of the course that you must pass with an 80% or higher to gain certification. Upon passing the test you will receive a temporary certification and a permanent certification will be mailed to you.

Requirements:

- You must be a Club member in good standing or on guarding staff
- You must be 13 or older

- Self-addressed stamped envelope (for permanent certification to be mailed to you)

Boat Dock Updates

More than 40 previously assigned spaces designated as OPEN

The elimination of the boat dock lottery used to permanently assign boat dock spaces has resulted in more than 40 spaces being available on a first come/first serve basis. The following chart identifies the OPEN spaces which will be marked with a special, green numbered tag. Only spaces marked with this tag are OPEN.

Members who have an assigned dock space at Club Park, Comet Row, Beach 3 and Beach 4 will continue to have those spaces as long as the conditions of the assignment are met, otherwise the assignment will be forfeited. When a space is forfeited, it will be converted to an “OPEN” space, marked

by the color tag that appears in this article containing the word “OPEN”.

For OPEN spaces on these docks, the approach to getting a dock space is identical to the methods historically used by members – “first come/first serve”.

Once the docks are in place late in April, members may secure one of these OPEN spaces by placing their boat with 2019 boating permits (each side of the bow) and a third 2019 boating permit on the OPEN numbered tag. No space may be claimed without a 2019 boating permit and a boat.

Dock spaces at Eckhart Sailing Center remain reserved for junior sailors and others participating in the Club’s sailing fleets.

Ecology Committee Road Cleanup Day




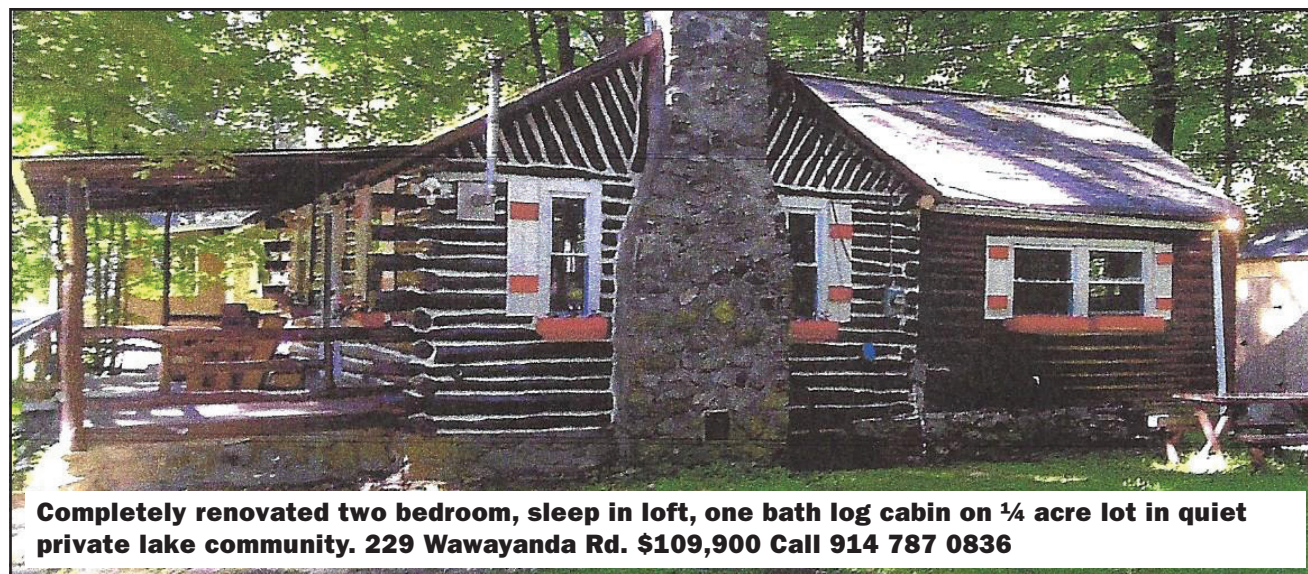
