
From the President's Desk



Summer Garbage Pickup

First pickup - Monday, July 1

The Club's summer garbage pickup for ten weeks with Blue Diamond Disposal begins on Monday, July 1. Garbage pickup services continue on Mondays throughout the summer and end on Tuesday, September 3 (due to Labor Day holiday). The schedule is as follows: July 1, 8, 15, 22, 29, August 5, 12, 19, and 26. The last pickup will be Tuesday, September 3. Please remember - your garbage must be out by 6:30 am on collection day.

Household garbage removal services through the Club are limited to one toter (supplied by Waste Management or Blue Diamond to their year-round customers) or the equivalent of three, 32 gallon regular size household garbage cans. Only household refuse will be picked up – no bulky waste, tires, construction debris, etc. and recycling is not provided.

Customers of Blue Diamond or Waste Management will be receiving letters explaining the amount of the credit you are entitled to on your invoice if you have paid your dues and assessments in full. Please note that both haulers will continue to provide recycling services to you during the Club's ten week period of service by Blue Diamond, for which you will be invoiced.

Only members in good standing are entitled to credits on their garbage bill. In order to ensure that you are provided with garbage service through the Club's contract with Blue Diamond, your dues and assessments must be paid not later than Sunday, June 30.

Ecology Corner

Beware--Garlic Mustard

As I was driving down Lakeside Drive West the other day, I was admiring the early flowers blooming along the road. I then noticed one plant in particular. The leaves were a triangular to somewhat rounded triangular shape with large serrated teeth on the edges and deep veins across the surface. I realized that those dainty white flowers with four quarter-inch long petals sitting atop 6 to 36 inch straight stems were in fact the invasive plant garlic mustard!

Garlic mustard may seem innocuous but it is just another example of everything green is not necessarily good. Garlic mustard grows almost anywhere. It likes sun but is shade tolerant. Native insects and animals do not typically feed on it. The rare West Virginia White Butterfly sometimes mistakenly lays its eggs on it but when the larvae hatch they cannot eat it so they die. And garlic mustard practices chemical warfare! It puts out biochemicals that inhibit competing native plants and beneficial soil fungi growth.

Each plant produces up to 3,000 seeds. The seeds form in inch to two-inch long vertical bean-like structures that look like a branch off the stem curving upward with no leaves. They are released in late summer to over-winter

and germinate the following spring. That's the bad news. The good news is that the seeds almost all germinate the following spring. Therefore no seeds persist in the soil for years as is the case with many invasive plants. So if you get rid of the plants now while they are flowering before they set seed, there's no need to bag them and there will be few if any to pull next year.

With current moist soils, garlic mustard pulls easily. Weed killer works but that is not the ecology committee's preferred approach. When pulling make sure to knock the dirt off the roots so they die. (The roots will wither even faster if you leave them in direct sun.)

Interestingly, if you are an adventurous foodie, garlic mustard is not only edible but tasty! Grinding the roots and putting them in white vinegar makes a condiment similar to horseradish. year beginning October 1 following the election and shall continue until such Officer's successor is duly elected and qualifies. No Officer shall hold the same office for more than two (2) consecutive terms. However, the provisions of this SECTION V shall have no application to any person serving as an Officer on August 18, 1985, and such person's term of office and the number of consecutive terms for which such person may hold the same office shall be governed by the By-Laws which were in effect at the time such person was first elected as such Officer.

The By-Laws, in Article V, Section VII establishes the qualifications for officer positions:

Candidates for the position of Officer shall have been Active Members in good standing for each of the three (3) years immediately preceding the election.

The President, or in his absence such other properly designated Officer shall preside over all official meetings of the Officers and Board of Trustees and meetings of the General Membership.


The President shall be responsible for the administration and direction of all Club affairs, subject at all times, however, to the By-Laws and to such policies as may be adopted by the Voting Board.

The President shall sign all membership cards.

The President and the Secretary shall sign all written contracts and written obligations and documents of the Club which have been authorized by proper vote of the Voting Board.

The President shall appoint all committee chairmen as shall be deemed necessary and shall act as ex-officio member of every such committee appointed by him. Said chairmen shall be approved by the Board of Trustees.

The First Vice President shall, in the absence of the President, take his place and perform those duties ascribed to the Office of President.

The First Vice President and Second Vice President shall perform such other administrative duties as may be delegated by the President.

The Secretary shall be custodian of all records of the Club; shall be responsible for the issuance of the minutes of all official meetings; shall conduct and carry on all correspondence at the direction of the President; and shall perform such other duties as may be delegated by the President.

The Treasurer shall be responsible for all of the financial records of the Club; shall issue all checks to cover disbursements of the Club, in accordance with these By-Laws (See Article VII, Section XIII); shall make all payments, as may be required by law, to Federal and State governments covering the employment of Club personnel; shall prepare and deliver financial reports, including trial balances, at each official meeting of the Voting Board, as well as at the Annual Meeting; shall present the Club books for Public Audit in October of each year; and shall perform such other duties involving the disposition of Club Funds as directed by the President and as authorized by the Voting Board.

After reviewing all of these qualifications, requirements and procedures, anyone who wishes to be considered for one of these positions should submit their Letter of Intent along with their qualifications to the Club Office, attention Nominating Committee, PO Box 578, Highland Lakes, NJ 07422 **not later than June 15, 2019.** You may also drop your letter through the Club Office's mail slot.

All candidates who express an interest will be considered equally and fairly. Please submit your Letter of Intent as soon as possible since the Committee must complete its work by early July.
