Boating Safety Certification

The Club will be offering a Boating Safety Course taught by the U.S. Coast Guard in the Lake Room on Sunday, July 14, 2019. The course will run from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Anyone interested in taking this course must sign up in advance with the Club Office by July 1, 2019. Please bring \$50.00 CASH (exact change preferred) the day of for the cost of the course.

There will be a test at the end of the course that you must pass with an 80% or higher to gain certification. Upon passing the test you will receive a temporary certification and a permanent certification will be mailed to you. Requirements:

- You must be a Club member in good standing or on guarding staff
- You must be 13 or older What to Bring:
- Pen, pencil, highlighter
- Drinks, snacks and lunch
- Self-addressed stamped envelope (for permanent certification to be mailed to you)

Beach Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliter. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.




Attention Jigsaw Puzzle Lovers

The following dates in July are the scheduled dates for the 2019 Lifeguarding Certification Class. Please note that the class costs \$100; a \$50 deposit is due by July 2 and the balance is due by July 9 (the start of the class). Checks can be made out to HLCC marked attention Water Safety. All classes are mandatory and any class exceeding 4 ½ hours will have a minimum ½ hour lunch break. Students are required to bring an exercise appropriate bathing suit, a notebook and something to write with every day of class. It is recommended that students bring 2 towels, a change of clothes, lunch and snacks, plenty of water and sun block. Students will be provided with a CPR mask and a textbook. Classes will be held rain or shine, and will meet at the swim lanes at the start of every day unless told otherwise.

Petitions for Officer and Trustee Positions Available

Filing Deadline - Monday, July 29, 2019

At this year's Annual Meeting on August 18, 2019, elections will be held for full, three-year terms commencing October 1, 2019, for the positions of President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary, as well as for Trustee positions for Sections 6, 7, 8, and 12.

In order for a candidate's name for Trustee to be on the ballot, a petition must be filed with the Elections Chairperson containing five signatures from members in good standing in the section electing a Trustee. Petitions are available at the Club Office only, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4 pm, and on Saturdays, 10 am to 1 pm. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 29, 2019.

The Nominating Committee is required to file its report of nominees for Officers' positions not less than thirty days before the Annual Meeting. Members not nominated may have their names placed on the ballot by filing a petition with the Elections Chairperson containing the signatures of sixty (60) members in good standing. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 29, 2019.

Please note that candidates for Treasurer must have experience in the field of Accounting. The requirements for eligibility to serve the Club as either a Trustee or Officer are found in Article V - Officers and Trustees of the By-Laws.

Once the Nominating Committee report is received and the petitions have been certified by the Elections Chairperson, Absentee Ballots will become available. The Absentee Ballot must be received at the Club Office, either by mail or in person, with your validated 2019 Membership Card enclosed in the provided envelope no later than Wednesday, August 14, 2019, at 4 pm.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting on August 18, 2019. If you do not use an Absentee Ballot and plan to vote at the Annual Meeting, please make sure that you attend this meeting and that you have your 2019 Membership Card and badge with you.

Once fully implemented in 2020 there will no longer be any trash receptacles available at Club areas with the exception of Beach 1 and the Clubhouse grounds. These areas include rights-of-way, the park on Canistear Road and all recreation areas in our community



Mile-A-Minute – Not a Welcome Find

The Ecology Committee along with the Conservation Club of HLCC have taken on the project of cleaning up, trimming, pruning and weeding the rain garden on the southeast side of the Clubhouse parking lot. While working on the project there was a very unwelcome development—we found the very invasive Mile-A-Minute vine.

Mile-a-minute is a nasty little plant that, as its name suggests, spreads extremely quickly. It can grow up to six inches per day! It can overwhelm a landscape in short order. It will cover gardens, flower beds, bushes, shrubs and even trees. It will steal their sunlight and thus kill them. In the one photo you can see it has grown up over four-foot tall tree tubes and just engulfed them. Its weight can break limbs on vegetation it has overgrown.

When you look up close you see almost an arrowhead shaped leaf, triangular with a V-notch at the back. The leaves can be pale to bright green when mature; but are sometimes reddish when young. The tiny (1/8 inch) flowers are greenish white to pink are in bloom from early summer to fall. Seed production can begin in July and run through November. Along the vine there are small more rounded and smaller leaves that the stem seems to grow straight through. And be careful, wear gloves and long sleeves when dealing with it, it has lots of sharp little thorns.

Note that it can grow in shade. We found it among other plants and vines, some of it shaded, some not. But once it gets established and gets into full sun it can explode. So be diligent. Find it now and rip it out. Spraying it with herbicide such as Round-up works but the vine is often on top of other plants you don't want to kill. In any event do

not let it get established or it will be a major battle for years. Seeds can remain viable in the dirt for up to six years. So even if you get it all now, you can still have more next year and the next and the next, etc.

When you do pull it, leave it in the sun to dry out. And pull it now while the thorns are young and soft—not next month when the fruit has started to set seed and the thorns have hardened. Once it has seed, pulling it may help disperse the seed. If it does have seed it needs to be bagged so it does not get spread accidentally. Unfortunately we now have another unwelcome visitor to our rural riparian retreat that must be dealt with. And, if you are not familiar with the Ecology Committee or the Conservation Club, check us out. The Ecology Committee is a group of Club members concerned with the ecology of Highland Lakes that provides education and policy guidance to promote best practices by all Club members. Meetings are open to all members and are held in the Clubhouse Lake Room the third Thursday of every month.

The Conservation Club is a group of members who perform maintenance and site improvements on Club owned parcels throughout the community. Some of our projects include water bars to prevent erosion in the numerous freeway lake access points; removal of invasive species; installing benches around the community, vegetation removal and more...join us! We generally meet at the Clubhouse at 9:30 am every Wednesday. But we are looking to add activities Saturday mornings to provide an opportunity to members who would like to participate, but are unavailable during the work week.

Summer Garbage Pickup

First pickup - Monday, July 1

The Club's summer garbage pickup for ten weeks with Blue Diamond Disposal begins on Monday, July 1. Garbage pickup services continue on Mondays throughout the summer and end on Tuesday, September 3 (due to Labor Day holiday). Customers of Blue Diamond or Waste Management will be receiving letters explaining the amount of the credit you are entitled to on your invoice if you have paid your dues and assessments in full. Please note that both haulers will continue to provide recycling services to you during the Club's ten week period of service by Blue Diamond, for which you will be invoiced.

Only members in good standing are entitled to credits on their garbage bill. In order to ensure that you are provided with garbage service through the Club's contract with Blue Diamond, your dues and assessments must be paid not later than Sunday, June 30.


