Petitions for Officer and Trustee Positions Available

ARTHUR D. DAWSON, PhD., ELECTIONS CHAIRPERSON

Filing Deadline - Monday, July 29, 2019

At this year's Annual Meeting on August 18, 2019, elections will be held for full, three-year terms commencing October 1, 2019, for the positions of President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary, as well as for Trustee positions for Sections 6, 7, 8, and 12.

In order for a candidate's name for Trustee to be on the ballot, a petition must be filed with the Elections Chairperson containing five signatures from members in good standing in the section electing a Trustee. Petitions are available at the Club Office only, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4 pm, and on Saturdays, 10 am to 1 pm. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 29, 2019.

The Nominating Committee is required to file its report of nominees for Officers' positions not less than thirty days before the Annual Meeting. Members not nominated may have their names placed on the ballot by filing a petition with the Elections Chairperson containing the signatures of sixty (60) members in good standing. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 29, 2019.

Please note that candidates for Treasurer must have experience in the field of Accounting. The requirements for eligibility to serve the Club as either a Trustee or Officer are found in Article V - Officers and Trustees of the By-Laws.

Once the Nominating Committee report is received and the petitions have been certified by the Elections Chairperson, Absentee Ballots will become available. The Absentee Ballot must be received at the Club Office, either by mail or in person, with your validated 2019 Membership Card enclosed in the provided envelope no later than Wednesday, August 14, 2019, at 4 pm.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting on August 18, 2019. If you do not use an Absentee Ballot and plan to vote at the Annual Meeting, please make sure that you attend this meeting and that you have your 2019 Membership Card and badge with you.

Boating Safety Certification

The Club will be offering a Boating Safety Course taught by the Coast Guard in the Lake Room on Sunday, July 14, 2019. The course will run from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Anyone interested in taking this course must sign up in advance with the Club Office by July 1, 2019. Please bring \$50.00 CASH (exact change preferred) the day of for the cost of the course.

There will be a test at the end of the course that you must pass with an 80% or higher to gain certification. Upon passing the test you will receive a temporary certification and a permanent certification will be mailed to you.

Requirements:

- You must be a Club member in good standing or on guarding staff
- You must be 13 or older

What to Bring:

- Pen, pencil, highlighter
- Drinks, snacks and lunch
- Self-addressed stamped envelope (for permanent certification to be mailed to you)

Beach Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliter. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

Ecology Corner

A Solution to a Silent Killer and Maimer of Wild Life

One of the most dangerous substances found in the waters of Highland Lakes is discarded monofilament fishing line. This line is deadly to our osprey eagles, cormorants and other birds as well as turtles, frogs and fish. Entanglements can lead to injury drowning, strangulation, and starvation. Death can also result from ingestion. What makes monofilament line especially insidious is that it takes 600 years to decompose.

A simple solution to alleviate the problem for fishermen is to use an empty tennis ball can with cap or other similar container to store discarded monofilament line. That includes short pieces cut off when tying knots or attaching lures and damaged or knotted line that is pulled off a reel. When fishing one should make sure to leave a minimum amount of line with a snagged lure or hook. The excess goes in the can.

Fishermen and the environmentally conscious members of Highland Lakes should have a tennis ball can or similar container with a lid and a pair of scissors in their boat, kayak, or canoe. Whenever you see a tangle of monofilament line on a tree, bush, or snagged on a log, remove it and place it in your container. We all need to be stewards of nature.

At the end of the day you can dispose of your clean line (no hooks, lures, weights, etc.) in the "Fishing Line Disposal Receptacles". They are located near the boat ramp next to Beach 2 near the docks on the side of the Clubhouse, at Comet Row, and at the freeways next to Beach 3 and Beach 7. If you wish to dispose of the line yourself cut it into lengths six inches or less. Place it in a sealed paper bag, and put it in with your garbage. Highland Lakes wildlife will thank you. Empty tennis ball cans are available at the Activity Center in the Clubhouse.




Hiking News
