While this is not yet a certainty, the majority of those on the board are interested in installing a water fountain that will enable members and guests to quench their thirst and eliminate the need for plastic bottles that are used once and then thrown away.

It was previously reported and at last week's meeting that the Clubhouse Committee has been unable to find enough volunteers to cook the food that is traditionally served during Family Day. A discussion followed and we will be exploring many of the options that were talked about. So often the good things that happen in this community depend upon volunteer engagement. Don't hold back. Testing results are also reported to the Sussex County Department of Health.

## Attention All Gardeners

## Filing Deadline - Monday, July 29, 2019

At this year's Annual Meeting on August 18, 2019, elections will be held for full, three-year terms commencing October 1, 2019, for the positions of President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary, as well as for Trustee positions for Sections 6, 7, 8, and 12.

In order for a candidate's name for Trustee to be on the ballot, a petition must be filed with the Elections Chairperson containing five signatures from members in good standing in the section electing a Trustee.
