Over \$6,000 Raised

More than 100 volunteers from the community joined The Goodwill Fundraising Committee to hold last week's 11th annual HLCC Community Yard Sale, which was a huge success in every way. In addition to raising funds (approximately \$6,700) for the HLCC Goodwill Fund, which helps members experiencing financial hardship, the sale was a festive gathering where members enjoyed the opportunity to mingle and enjoy refreshments while they shopped.

"The number of people who turned out to help from setting up and taking donations the day prior to the sale, to staffing the tables and helping to run things on sale day, really shows the level of generosity of our community here in Highland Lakes," said Liz Holda, who co-chairs the committee with Nancy Eisenberg.

Thanks to donations that poured in the day before the sale, bargain-priced treasures filled every inch of the tables in the Seckler room, where pink-shirted volunteers were on hand to assist buyers. A large selection of furniture, sporting goods and other larger items were also on display on the lawn out front, where more volunteers braved the heat to handle outdoor sales. Inside the Lake Room, the Women's Auxiliary of Highland Lakes added to the coffers by selling coffee, baked goods and bagels. And the HLCC Teen Council also pitched in by running a popcorn and lemonade stand in the front as well.

A steady stream of buyers came from all over to spend for the cause, browsing the wide array of treasures, which ranged from kitchen goods, fine dishware and appliances to tools, craft materials and toys. "This is my favorite day of the year!" said one happy shopper, as she departed with a large bag of finds.

Planning for this event takes place throughout the year, with the Goodwill Fundraising Committee soliciting donations, selecting and promoting a date for the event and rallying volunteers. In addition to accepting contributions, organizing displays by category (kitchen items, fine dishware, holiday, sports, toys, etc.) and working the sale itself, volunteers also handle a massive post-event cleanup that includes loading left over items onto trucks bound for charitable organizations and restoring order to the clubhouse. This undertaking would not be possible without a dedicated group of people devoting their time and energy. The Goodwill Committee would like to thank everyone in our community who participated in making this event all that it was: Volunteers who gave so much of their time before, during and after the sale; Club office staff, Clubhouse staff and Club maintenance crew; members who donated goods to be sold; Women's Club who made refreshments and staffed the table; volunteers who staffed the Path to Goodwill table; volunteers who manned the grills; vendors who supported the event by purchasing tables; buyers who came out in droves, and went home with their arms full; Teen Council who ran a lemonade/popcorn stand; the Junior Goodwill Fundraising Committee members and volunteers who helped load and unload cars and trucks.

And finally, credit for starting this fun and worthwhile event should be given to founding members Dolores Gaspari, Grace Lewin and the late Virginia McNulty, who started this fun and worthwhile event 11 years ago.

Ecology Corner

BARBARA JAGGI, CHAIRPERSON, ECOLOGY COMMITTEE

The two largest lakes in New Jersey have been closed to swimming due to algae blooms. These waters have been determined to be toxic and are harmful to both humans and pets. Highland Lakes management, Princeton Hydro, and Solitude Lake Management work together to ensure the safety and water quality of our lakes. It is a natural phenomenon to have a certain amount of green algae during weather patterns we have been experiencing i.e. heavy rains followed by hot weather. Solitude has been carefully monitoring and treating our lakes as needed.

Algae is fed by nutrients that enter the lakes via storm water runoff. All property owners in our watershed, not just lakefront property owners, can make a difference. Storm water runoff is rainwater that falls onto impervious surfaces such as roads, rooftops, and other paved surfaces, and runs downhill until it drains into a body of water. As the water flows over these surfaces, pollutants, such as debris, sediment, and chemicals are picked up and deposited into lakes, streams, and rivers.

Pollutants carried by storm water runoff include:

- Animal waste
- Soaps and cleaners
- •Litter/debris
- Sediment
- Motor Oil/grease
- Bacteria
- Yard clippings
- Migraples
- rard clippings
- Microplastics

• Fertilizers and pesticides

- The consequences of storm water runoff:
- Decline in water quality and clarity from pollutants and sediment
- •Impeded navigation due to sediment
- Increased weed and algae growth due to excess nutrients

- Unsafe water for swimming from bacteria and pathogens
- Harm to aquatic life from debris as well as hazardous materials (pesticides, paints, motor oil, etc.)
- Erosion of stream banks and loss of habitat

Help prevent runoff and erosion:

- Plant a vegetative buffer at least ten feet wide by the lake's edge.
- Plant native trees, shrubs and wildflowers.
- Consider including a rain garden. This buffer can keep geese off your property and filter out pollutants while slowing runoff into the lake.
- Add trees, shrubs, and mulch to expanses of lawn in order to capture and hold rainwater.
- Divert on-site runoff and rain gutters to gardens or small depressions where water has time to infiltrate the soil
- Consider using pavers or crushed stone for your driveway rather than impervious asphalt.
- Minimize the use of fertilizers and pesticides in your garden. The fertilizers that make your plants grow, also encourage lake algae. While phosphates have been eliminated from dishwasher detergent, inspect every label of other cleaning products used in your home and choose those with low or non-phosphorous formulations.

Look for more information on how we can protect our lakes in the next issue of the Newsette. Consider what it would do to our property values and quality of life here in Highland Lakes if swimming was to be banned.





Filing Deadline - Monday, July 29, 2019

At this year's Annual Meeting on August 18, 2019, elections will be held for full, three-year terms commencing October 1, 2019, for the positions of President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary, as well as for Trustee positions for Sections 6, 7, 8, and 12.

In order for a candidate's name for Trustee to be on the ballot, a petition must be filed with the Elections Chairperson containing five signatures from members in good standing in the section electing a Trustee. Petitions are available at the Club Office only, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4 pm, and on Saturdays, 10 am to 1 pm. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 29, 2019.

The Nominating Committee is required to file its report of nominees for Officers' positions not less than thirty days before the Annual Meeting. Members not nominated may have their names placed on the ballot by filing a petition with the Elections Chairperson containing the signatures of sixty (60) members in good standing. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 29, 2019.

Please note that candidates for Treasurer must have experience in the field of Accounting. The requirements for eligibility to serve the Club as either a Trustee or Officer are found in Article V - Officers and Trustees of the By-Laws.

Once the Nominating Committee report is received and the petitions have been certified by the Elections Chairperson, Absentee Ballots will become available. The Absentee Ballot must be received at the Club Office, either by mail or in person, with your validated 2019 Membership Card enclosed in the provided envelope no later than Wednesday, August 14, 2019, at 4 pm.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting on August 18, 2019. If you do not use an Absentee Ballot and plan to vote at the Annual Meeting, please make sure that you attend this meeting and that you have your 2019 Membership Card and badge with you.
