## **From the President's Desk**

What a difference a few days can make... Thanksgiving dinner leftovers are still crowding the refrigerator and yet one look outside the window today tells me we seem to have skipped a season and time-warped into the depths of winter.

This early December storm has battered our area with ice, snow, fallen tree limbs and downed power lines, making quite a mess of just about everything for everyone. As I write this on Tuesday, December 3, more than half of our community remains without power, and Sussex Rural Electric's crews continue to discover more damage to wires and poles as they work to restore power. Many members will remember the Ice Storm from a few years back that wreaked havoc in Highland Lakes. During that storm, it seemed that dead trees and limbs were the most frequent victims to the weighty ice and snow. While the Club has been vigilant in removing dead trees along its roadways, this most recent storm saw healthy trees filled with ice and snow, damaging wires and disrupting power with similar destructive effect.

Even if you can't control all of the variables, it's better to plan ahead than to be unprepared. When the Clubhouse parking lot project was in full swing a few years ago, the Club office and Voting Board thought ahead to situations like the one we're in today and thought, "This plan should accommodate for the future installation of a generator to power the entire Clubhouse during emergencies." With that in mind, underground conduit and a transfer switch were installed along with a generator pad to bring power to the Club. Unfortunately this emergency weather situation occurred before we could have a generator in place. The Club will nevertheless be formally requesting bids from vendors in January to complete the project. It may not provide us solace today, but in the years ahead as we face weather situations such as the one we're in right now this type of forethought will reward members throughout our community with warm refuge in times of trouble.

We extend our appreciation to Mayor Shortway and the members of the Vernon Township Council for their approval of the agreement between the Township, the Club, and property owners along Breakneck Road making it clear that responsibility for sidewalk maintenance and snow removal is not the responsibility of the property owners abutting the sidewalk, many of whom (including the Club) donated or sold property to Vernon for the construction of the sidewalk with that understanding.

Hard as it may be at this particular moment in time, let's all give thanks for what we do have. We live in a wonderful community full of family, friends, and caring neighbors. It takes a lot more than nights of cold and darkness to put a damper on Highland Lakes. I wish you all a holiday season full of peace and cheer...and abundant electricity.

## Holiday Safety Tips at the Lake

The holiday season can be a wonderful time of the year that we look forward to and connect with friends and family, but Christmas décor, traditions and celebrations can come with some unwanted surprises. These are some tips to have a safe and healthy holiday season. Inspect electrical decorations before each use. Do not overload electrical outlets, just because the power strip has eight outlets, you do not need to use all of them. How many lights are too many? That's a question for the ages. Newer LED lights draw much less amperage, however traditionalists prefer the older incandescent bulbs, and with those, you should never plug more than three strings together. Remember to always inspect the wires for fraying or cracking. At night, or when you leave the house, unplug them if you can. Trees are a fire risk, even if it's artificial. Make sure your tree is at least three feet away from all heat sources. If it's a real tree, remember it needs water, the drier the tree the greater its chance to ignite. There are over 200 Christmas tree fires reported annually, and countless others that never are reported. Candles are nice, but it is still an open flame, consider battery operated ones. If you are going to use them, they should be 12 inches away from objects, and never leave them unattended, even in the bathroom.

The fireplace is not a place to throw wrapping paper Christmas morning. The coatings on the paper can be hazardous to your health. Fireplaces should be inspected annually for soundness, obstructions, and creosote buildup according to the National Fire Protection Association. How often to get it cleaned depends on how much use, it gets throughout the year. Always make sure that your embers have cooled before you leave the house or go to sleep. NEVER place them in a plastic container. ALWAYS make sure they are in a metal bin with a top that is at least 25 feet from your house. Never throw a log outside that you think may be cool as well. If you have a fireplace screen use it. They are designed to prevent sparks from the fire from entering the house, and it also prevents children and pets from coming in contact with the fire.

If you drop a glass ornament on the floor, a moist piece of bread will pick up all those small shards of glass before your foot does, then sweep the area and go over it with a vacuum. Do not be a victim of too much clutter with holiday decorations in your cabin. Make sure your pets are safe as well. Holly, mistletoe, and poinsettias are toxic to dogs and cats when ingested. Have a safe holiday and a Happy New Year.

The surgery is scheduled for December 27, 2019. The leg will be casted to protect the current bone growth., Massimo is hoping to snowboard again by March.



## **Ecology Corner**

#### **Plant bird-friendly shubbery**

We are just weeks away from the official start of winter. Many of us have bird feeders that we stock for our feathered friends. However looking ahead we might want to consider planting shrubbery that produces food for the birds as well

Cedar waxwings, wintering tree swallows, bluebirds and catbirds like the food produced by a combination of deciduous, semi evergreen and evergreen shrubs that bear small fruits such as eastern red cedar, Rocky Mountain juniper, northern bayberry, winterberry, and southern wax myrtle.

Winterberry in particular is a lovely addition to any property. It produces red berries that look beautiful and in the dead of winter provides food for the birds. See the photo below taken on the east side of the main lake. To me there is nothing more peaceful than winter. It is a quiet time of the year, time to reflect. Let us all give thanks for our families, friends, and the natural beauty that surrounds us.
