## Let's Clarify the Rules

The time of year is here when most Highland Lakers have already received or will soon pick up their packet containing the correct number of badges, car permits and boat and dock permits. Any adjustment to these numbers should be made at the time of receipt by registering or deregistering cars, boats, docks, etc.

#### **Badges**

According to the Club's Rules and Regulations No. 1, current badges must be worn when participating in Club or Clubhouse activities. What exactly does the word "activities" encompass? If you or your children are at one of the beaches or swimming in or boating on one of the lakes, a badge should be worn. If you are fishing from the shoreline or a boat, you should have your badge on. If you are playing at a playground or ball field, or playing basketball, baseball, softball, tennis, pickleball, or bocce at one of our facilities, you should have your badge on. If you or your children are involved in the many activities taking place at the Clubhouse, a badge should be worn. A good rule of thumb is: Wear your Badge. Also remember that your





guests need to have guest badges to use Club facilities or participate in Club activities. These can be purchased for \$1 at the Activity Center or from a lifeguard.

## **Car Permits**

Rule No. 15 of the Club's Rules and Regulations states that once registered with the Club, all vehicles must display a current parking permit at the rear of the car on the driver's side when parked on Club property. Some members have stated that the permits affixed to the car body result in sun damage or become impossible to remove. The Club offers several options. One is

to affix the permit to the lower left corner of the rear window. Another, if you don't have a heavily tinted rear window, is to tape it facing out to the lower left of the rear window. The third is to place the permit or the permit attached to a piece of cardboard (for strength) on the rear sill. If your vehicle doesn't have one, place the permit on the dash. Owners of cars without properly displayed permits will be warned, fined, and have a large sticker placed on their side window.

Temporary car permits for your guest can be obtained free of charge when you purchase guest badges from the lifeguards or at the Activity Center. Permanent or temporary permits must be visible in any vehicle parked on Club property.

### **Boat and Dock Permits**

Rule No. 5 states that "all boats must be registered with the state and have a current Highland Lakes sticker affixed on the exterior bow..." This rule is simple enough. Just remember you need two permits per boat, one on each side of the exterior bow, and that all boats must be registered with the state.

## Let's Clarify The Rules Continued from Page 1

Rule No. 6 states "all docks must be registered with the Club and display a current HLCC permit. This includes all personal shore line docks, floating swimming docks, and inflatable bouncer/trampolines. You must also use a boating permit if you keep your boat on a Club dock or boat rack.

Primarily, these permits identify the boats and docks of dues paying members in good standing. They also help to identify boats and docks if they break free in a storm or after "ice out". The permit with the member number enables the Club to identify your boat and let you know its location. Many members received old Club docks last year. If you received one or more, make sure you register and place a permit on each one individually, even if you have bolted the docks together. Four retired Club docks broke free this spring. Without permits, the owners could not be easily identified to expedite their return.

Why do we have badges, car, boat and dock permits? In addition to helping us find lost boats or docks, they help to identify us as members of the Highland Lakes community and ensure that only those dues paying members who have chosen to vacation, summer, or permanently live here will be able to enjoy the many facilities, activities, and the wondrous beauty of Highland Lakes. We all pay yearly dues and assessments for the privilege of living or vacationing in this special place. Wear your badges, put permits on your cars, boats, and docks and be proud of the great community you have helped to build.

## **Gypsy Moths**

It was not until two weeks ago when the first gypsy moth infestation reports were received at the Club office. Since then, a list of members reporting problems has been prepared, information is being gathered, and communications with the office of Mayor Marotta have been established.

Our problems have also been communicated to Joseph Zoltowski, Director of the New Jersey Department of Agriculture's Division of Plant Industry (the "Division"). Mr. Zoltowski reports that last year's aerial survey (http://www. state.nj.us/agriculture/divisions/pi/pdf/2014gmsurvey.pdf) of our area did not note areas of defoliation, and this year's survey by the Division is being conducted within the next week or so. He commented "Remember that the trees are not dead and will refoliate even though they are stripped of foliage. Certainly a lot of calls of gypsy moth sightings in the northern counties of the state, even from areas where we did not find any egg masses during our surveys." He also reported that eastern Pennsylvania is severely affected, and migration on the wind may be one source of our area's problems this year.

The opportunity for aerial spraying this year has passed. In order for that to have taken place, municipalities must request a fall ground survey of egg masses. Based on the count per acre, a recommendation is made whether aerial spraying is warranted.

Highland Lakes sent a letter this week to Mayor Marotta asking that Vernon Township request that the Division conduct a ground survey this fall. If spraying in the spring of 2016 is determined to be warranted, then a cost sharing

agreement by Vernon with the Division is required. We have requested Mayor Marotta's support for the inclusion of sufficient funds in next year's municipal budget to accomplish aerial spraying.

There are options for individual homeowners – this link (http://www.nj.gov/agriculture/divisions/pi/prog/gmquestions. html) from the Division is helpful. Detailed information about the gypsy moth is available from many sources – Penn State's page (http://ento.psu.edu/extension/factsheets/gypsy-moth) is also helpful. We are all concerned about the loss of our trees. However, Mr. Zoltowski has commented that a healthy tree can withstand two and perhaps three years of defoliation before succumbing to the stress of gypsy moth defoliation. It is that fact that makes preparations for aerial spraying in 2016 critically important.

Discussions will be taking place with companies that conduct ground spraying as suggested by the Division. Homeowners are encouraged to read the information below (thanks to Steve Zane and Mary Romme for the information from the City of Glendale, Wisconsin) and implement the suggested measures. As information develops we will provide update on the website and in the Newsette. 

## Celebrate July 4 the Way it Was Celebrated in 1776

On July 4th at 10:30 am, all Highland Lakes residents are welcome to attend a reading of the Declaration of Independence in the Lake Room. Refreshments will be served.

It once was said: "Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction. We didn't pass it on to our children in the bloodstream. It must be fought for, protected, and handed on for them to do the same, or one day we will spend our sunset years telling our children and our children's children what it was once like in the United States where men were free."

While the 4th of July is a great national kick-off to summer in our nation, it was the approval of the Declaration of Independence by the Second Continental Congress on July 4, 1776, that provided us with the well-deserved reason for this celebration of freedom. Listen to the famous words of Thomas Jefferson and the other Founding Fathers, who risked everything to make the United States the first nation

ever to be founded on universal principles of human rights and individual freedom. Learn why the Declaration of Independence expresses truths about mankind that people throughout the world have looked to as a beacon in their quest for freedom from oppression ever since and which, like an earthquake, jolted the foundation of every single government to come before it and after it.

Highland Lakes resident Ron Berutti, an attorney and a published author on topics of constitutional history, will read the Declaration of Independence and provide some historical context to better understand the events leading to the Declaration of Independence, and what the signers were trying to accomplish. Afterward, an open discussion will take place as to the Declaration's meaning, its important role in the eternal struggle for freedom and its continued vitality in today's world. Younger residents of Highland Lakes who may not know much about the story

of the American Revolution or who may question the relevance of the Declaration of Independence to their lives today are particularly encouraged to attend. Adult

residents who can share their American experiences are also encouraged to attend, so that we can learn from one another about how the torch of liberty has been carried forward to this day and how we can help carry it forward into the future so that freedom may be preserved for future generations of Americans.

This is the fourth year for this event. The first three years' readings were wellattended and well-received by residents of all ages, and a lively and civil discussion took place among those in attendance. If you missed





## New Protocol for the Kitchen

CAROL HASTIE, CHAIRPERSON, CLUBHOUSE COMMITTEE

These are some guidelines that need to be followed to meet the standards of the Board of Health and Food Handling License. We are asking everyone who uses the kitchen to help with this. The sinks in the kitchen are to be used for food preparation and the rinsesanitize cycle for dishes, glasses, utensils, pots, pans, etc. The sinks need to be cleaned after each use. There are supplies on the shelf next to the food prep sink for this purpose. Cleaning of paint supplies, tools, mops and anything else should not be done in the sinks in the kitchen. There is a slop sink in the utility closet for that purpose. Any food item going into the refrigerator and/or freezer must be labeled with the date it goes in, who it belongs to and the expiration date. If any food item is found not labeled properly, it will be discarded immediately.

There are labels provided for that use on the ledge of the refrigerator. We will be checking on a frequent basis. Please help us out; we don't want to throw out something that you meant to keep. If you have something left over from an event, it would be nice to leave it for the staff, but unfortunately it usually ends up being thrown away. There are places that would be happy to receive your gift, and it will be put into good use in the community. Thanks you for your cooperation in this matter.


