Extended Office Hours

Beach Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent fecal coliform testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 200. All samples conformed to state recreational bathing standards. Testing results are reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

Ladies' Pickleball



Summer Garbage Pickup

First pickup - Monday, July 3

The Club's summer garbage pickup for ten weeks with Blue Diamond Disposal begins on Monday, July 3. Pickup on Mondays will continue throughout the summer and end on Tuesday, September 5 (due to Labor Day holiday). The schedule is as follows: July 3, 10, 17, 24, 31, August 7, 14, 21, and 28. The last pickup will be Tuesday, September 5 (due to the Labor Day Holiday). Please note that the Club's services do not include recycling.

Customers of Blue Diamond or Waste Management will be receiving letters explaining the amount of the credit you are entitled to on your invoice if you have paid your dues and assessments in full. Please note that both haulers will continue to provide recycling services to you during the Club's ten week period of service by Blue Diamond.

Only members in good standing are entitled to credits on their garbage bill. In order to ensure that you are provided with garbage service through the Club's contract with Blue Diamond, your dues and assessments must be paid not later than Sunday, July 2. Please remember - your garbage must be out by 6:30 am on collection day.

Rules for Boat Storage on Club Docks and Racks

With the boating season rapidly approaching it is again time for members to review the Club's boat storage rules before placing their boats on Club property.

Extensive changes were adopted by the Voting Board in May 2014 that addressed the storage and use of Club lands, boat racks and docks for boat storage. These changes were necessitated by the use of boating facilities by members not in good standing, members who fail to remove their boats from docks and boat racks in the fall, members who leave boats tied up to trees, etc., and those who disregard the permanent assignment of docking space at major locations such as Comet Row, Beaches 3 and 4, Club Park, and the Eckhart Sailing Center.

With an investment of more than \$500,000 in new docks over the past three years, these rules also prohibit any

modification, drilling, etc. and establish requirements for how boats are to be moored to the new docks.

These Rules, in six parts, constitute the Club's Rules pertaining to the storage of boats, kayaks, windsurfers, etc. on Club lands, boat racks and docks.

A. HOLD HARMLESS: The member agrees to indemnify and hold the Club harmless from any injury, damage or loss resulting from the use and storage of the member's boat anywhere on Club property, including but not limited to lands, docks and boat racks. The member, by keeping their boat on Club lands, docks or boat racks, acknowledges that the Club shall not be responsible for any injury, damage or loss whatsoever resulting from the removal, transport and storage of the boat, and use of the Club's lands, docks and boat racks.

B. IMPROPER STORAGE: Improper storage is defined as storage on lands owned by the Club other than on docks and boat racks, storage anywhere on Club properties without a current membership permit, and storage in violation of Rule 24 (C.), (D.) and/or (E.) below. Boats improperly stored will be removed to storage immediately.

C. STORAGE ON DOCKS and RACKS AFTER OCTOBER 15: All boats must be removed from Club docks not later than October 15 of each year. In alternating years, all boats must be removed from boat racks by October 15, as determined by the Boat and Dock Committee and as published in the Newsette. Boats stored after October 15 in violation of this Rule will be removed to storage immediately.

D. UNAUTHORIZED USE OF SPACE ON ASSIGNED DOCKS: Space on certain Club docks is restricted to assigned use only. These docks are located at Club Park, Comet Row, Eckhart Sailing Center, Beach 3, Beach 4, and such other, future locations as may be authorized by the Voting Board. Docks subject to this

assigned space requirement are marked with appropriate signs. Dock space assignments are managed by the Boat and Dock Committee upon receipt of applications from members in good standing and are assigned by the committee through the use of a lottery system and other methods. Boats not authorized by the committee on these docks will be removed to storage immediately.

E. DOCK MODIFICATIONS AND UNCOATED
WIRE PROHIBITED: Members may not drill holes in
any dock or fasten any device without the authorization
of the Boat and Dock Committee. Only ropes, chain and
plastic coated wire are authorized to attach a boat to a
dock. Uncoated wire is specifically prohibited. Members are
responsible for all damages caused by unauthorized drilling
or fastening to the dock or excessive wear or chafing caused
by the use of unauthorized attachment methods. Boats
stored on docks in violation of this Rule will be removed to
storage immediately.

F. REMOVAL TO STORAGE, PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS: Boats, kayaks, windsurfers, etc. of members stored in violation of these Rules shall be removed to storage, and will be subject to a special assessment of \$100.00, and a daily storage charge of \$5.00, calculated from the date the boat was removed to storage up to November 15, when a special winter storage fee of \$250.00 will be imposed. After June 15, a disposal fee of \$250.00 will be imposed. Boats may not be retrieved between November 15 and April 15. Members whose boats are identifiable through the boating permit shall be provided notice by regular and certified mail that the boat has been removed to storage. The Club may, in its sole discretion, elect to acquire title to any boat that has been determined to be abandoned, in compliance with the "Abandoned Vessels Disposition Law," N.J.S.A. 12:7C-7 et seq. (Amended September 23, 2009).



Motor Boat Registration and Title Requirements

NJ MOTOR VEHICLE COMMISSION (MVC)

Registration

Most boats must be registered to operate on New Jersey waterways.

- All titled boats must be registered also.
- Any boat (including jet skis and nontitled watercraft), mechanically propelled (including electric motors), regardless of length, must be registered.
- Boats greater than 12 feet in length, regardless of propulsion means, must be titled and registered at MVC office.

Boats and marine equipment which **need not be** registered:

- here less than 180 consecutive days that are operating under a federally-approved numbering system from another state
- Ship's lifeboats
- Non-motorized vessels used exclusively on small lakes and ponds on private property
- Racing vessels with New Jersey State Marine Police permit
- Non-motorized inflatable device, surfboard, racing shell, dinghy, canoe or kayak
- Non-motorized vessel less than 12 feet in length

Title

For use on New Jersey waterways, all boats more than 12 feet in length must be titled, with the exception of ship's lifeboat, canoe, kayak, inflatable, surfboard, rowing scull, racing shell, tender/dinghy used for direct transportation between a vessel and shore for no other purposes.

Boat Operator License (MVC)

An operator license is required to operate power vessels on fresh, non-tidal waters such as lakes, creeks and rivers. (Minimum age 16 years; with certain exceptions.)

Boat Safety Certificate (NJSP)

A boat safety certificate (from an approved boat safety course; see NJSP website, below) is required to operate a personal watercraft or power vessel, including electric motors, in NJ waters (tidal and non-tidal)

Soft Plastics for Early Spring

Spring is here, and as the water temperatures around Highland Lakes begin to rise past the 55-degree mark, the bass will begin to move in to the shallows. Early spring is a great time to break out those soft plastic baits and hit the banks. Try tying on a wacky rigged Senko or 7" Power worm and cast as close as you can towards the bank, then start fishing and twitching it back slowly. Those will be weightless and great for catching fish hanging out in less than a foot of water. Carolina rigged creature baits will work well both in the shallows and then bumped down the rocky drop offs for smallmouth bass. Swim baits in various sizes equipped with a jig head have been highly effective in the 2-6 foot deep range and have been bringing musky follows to the boat on the main lake. The Fishing Committee will hold its next meeting June 8 at 8 pm in the Lake Room, please join us.

Ecology Clean-Up Day


