#### Petitions for Officer and Trustee Positions Available

PATRICK MCNULTY, ELECTIONS CHAIRPERSON

#### Filing Deadline - Monday, July 31

At this year's Annual Meeting on August 20, 2017, elections will be held for full, three-year terms commencing October 1, 2017, for Trustee positions for Sections 1, 3, 4, and 5.

In order for a candidate's name for Trustee to be on the ballot, the candidate must reside in the section, be a property owner and have been a member in good standing for the three years immediately preceding the election. The candidate is required to file a petition with the Elections Chairperson containing five signatures from members in good standing in the section electing a Trustee. Petitions will be available at the Club Office only, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4 pm, and on Saturdays, 10 am to 1 pm beginning July 3, 2017. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 31, 2017.

Once the petitions have been certified by the Elections Chairperson, Absentee Ballots will become available. The Absentee Ballot must be received at the Club Office, either by mail or in person, with your validated 2017 Membership Card enclosed in the provided envelope no later than Wednesday, August 16, 2017, at 4 pm.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting on August 20. Please make sure that you attend this meeting and that you have your 2017 Membership Card and badge with you.

#### **Beach Testing Results**

Below are the results of the most recent fecal coliform testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 200. All samples conformed to state recreational bathing standards. Testing results are reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

#### Fishing Lure Retrieval

I was recently contacted by a handful of lakefront homeowners, regarding fishing lures that have been found stuck on private docks, and asked if I could address the issue via the Newsette. Upwards of 10 or more lures were found embedded in one dock on a single weekend alone. Doing our best to retrieve stuck lures isn't just so that we don't have to waste money replacing them; it's also to help avoid the hazards that they can pose when left there. Children and pets can inadvertently step on hooks lodged in deck boards and birds have been found to mistake hooked rubber worms for real ones. While it is completely understandable that certain circumstances may make retrieval impossible; dangerous rocks, thunderstorms, heavy wind, etc... we, as responsible anglers, should do our best to pull watercrafts close enough that we can get them back. Or, if on foot, try to notify the homeowner that you would like to walk through the property and dislodge it.

#### **Carp Bounty**

#### MICHAEL EWASKO, CHAIRMAN, FISHING COMMITTEE

It has come to this committees attention that the invasive Carp species of fish have been spotted in our main lake. Known as Carp, Grass Carp or Koi this species is not native to our waters but have probably been around for some time.

Introduced to American waters during the mid-1800s, bottom-feeding carp quickly become a domineering species in lakes, churning up sediment, uprooting plants and reproducing in mass numbers. It is this concern that has caused the New Jersey Division of Fish & Wildlife to recommend removal of Carp from local lakes and strictly require non-release of Carp caught while fishing. In an effort to improve our fishery the HLCC Fish Committee is offering a bounty on any Carp removed from our lake(s).

The program will run from July 4th to Sept 4th and will be open to children and adults alike. A fishing related prize will be awarded to all verified catches. A cell phone photo or phone call to Michael Ewasko 973-508-2709 or Mark Grammerstorf 845-544-5824 will suffice as verification.

How do you catch a Carp?

There's the challenge. Small fish in stained waters can be easy marks. But most carp are harder to come by, especially for budding carp fans. Big fish can be especially wary, thanks to their longevity and amazing senses of hearing, taste, vision, and feel. Fortunately, there's no shortage of choices in carp baits for effectively targeting carp of all proportions. Carp eat a variety of foods. They favor insects, aquatic worms, crustaceans, and mollusks, but also consume algae and other plant matter. Due to this diverse diet, a variety of carp baits trip their triggers, from natural offerings to homemade doughbaits and even corn.

As for Carp disposal the recommendation is the same as with any other litter - take it home with you. You can cook

them, smoke them or bury them in your garden for the best fertilizer ever! You can of course bag them and put them out with the trash. Just DO NOT leave them along the shore. Good luck to all.

Ahoy sailors! It's time again to think sailing and tube storage. This year we have expanded the number of tubes at Eckhart Sailing Center from 15 to 22 in total. We will also be adding 5 new tubes at Comet Row. As always, Junior fleet racing sailors have the first right of refusal for the tube storage system at the Eckhart Sailing Center. Junior sailors and/or their parents need to email to request a tube no later than July 1, 2017, or call to reserve a tube for this sailing season. Please mark emails: Sailing Tube Request in subject line to HLCCSailing@gmail.com with name of sailor, parent name if junior and fleet sailing.

We will confirm active junior sailors with the Junior Fleet Captain, email you the release form to sign/return and assign your tube number. Additionally, any remaining tubes not assigned to juniors will be available to the other racers in fleets docked at Eckhart Sailing Center and Comet Row via email request. First come, first served.

#### Here are the basic rules for review to use the tubes:

- 1. Do not put wet sails in the tubes. Dry sails only.
- 2. Junior sailors have first right of refusal due to parent transportation considerations.
- 3. Lock and combination information must be provided on the form.
- 4. No wet items of any kind shall be placed in tube.
- 5. Only HL racing fleet sailors can utilize tubes.
- 6. Only non-lakefront members can use this option.
- 7. Only one set of sails with spars per tube.
- 8. Storage is only during the sail racing season. No year-round storage.
- 9. When Club docks go in water and are taken out, so must your sails!
- 10. Any abuse of the tubes forfeits your rights to use them.

#### **Closer Than You Think**

It's no secret that fish love cover. Bass will hang back into blankets of lily pads, fallen structure and tuck back under the docks. Here they can be found taking a break from the midday heat, and waiting to ambush prey. If you have ever taken a cast from a boat, and pitched it under a dock, you are aware of the large fish these areas can hold. But if you find yourself taking a few cast off of shore, don't neglect the dock you're standing on. Better yet, take a few casts before you even set foot off the grass and disturb the waters surface, alerting them to your presence. Cast out to the end of the dock, towards one side and slowly bring your lure back. This technique works best with unweighted plastics, curly tail grubs or small suspending lures. Give it a try, and you might be surprised what's right beneath your feet.
