From the President's Desk

Our Voting Board workshop this month was quite informative and filled with discussion. It began with a presentation from Mike Gillooley, a past treasurer of the Voting Board who now serves with Brian Morton as co-chair of the Planning Committee. Mike reported that the committee was looking at ways to address properties in our community that were not being properly maintained and offered a number of ideas that he and his committee thought they would pursue. The board sanctioned the committee's plan and we look forward to an update in coming months. (The Planning Committee meets regularly. If topics like this are of interest to you and/or you have professional experience that would aid us in our attempts to keep our community beautiful and moving forward, call the Club office to find out when the next Planning Committee meeting is and come on down).

Discussion of short-term rentals continued from last month's meeting and ultimately led to a discussion of our By-Laws with regard to the requirement that those who rent their property (regardless of the length of stay) are expected to register the rental (and the identity of those renting) with the Club and pay an Associate Membership fee. Fees are based on duration of the rental: \$50 for each week, \$100 for each month, and \$300 for each year. Once registered, the Associate

Member is entitled to purchase badges (\$10/badge) which then enables them to use Club facilities. This process helps us to defray the community's operational costs, but more importantly keeps Club management aware of who is currently residing in our private community. Many members who rent their homes follow this process, but some, regrettably ignore it. At this month's workshop the board directed the By-Laws Committee to examine ways to amend the By-Law related to Associate Membership so that there would be an automatic and significant penalty if ignored.

Other items on the agenda, which will be voted on at the upcoming Voting Board meeting, included mention of the proposal received to evaluate the electrical infrastructure of our clubhouse and the requirements for air conditioning; a proposed survey of Beach 3 in preparation for wetlands investigations and site improvements; and the renaming of the HL Jogathon to pay tribute to Frank Henninger, a dear Club member who died this year. Frank is the person who started the HL Jogathon way back when I was a teenager (in the 1970s). He gave an enormous amount of heart (and time) to this community and anyone who knew him will surely remember him as a kind, gentle, happy, hard-working man who was devoted to his family and Highland Lakes.

Below are the results of the most recent fecal coliform testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 200. All samples conformed to state recreational bathing standards. Testing results are reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

Petitions for Officer and Trustee Positions Available

PATRICK MCNULTY, ELECTIONS CHAIRPERSON

Filing Deadline - Monday, July 31

At this year's Annual Meeting on August 20, 2017, elections will be held for full, three-year terms commencing October 1, 2017, for Trustee positions for Sections 1, 3, 4, and 5.

In order for a candidate's name for Trustee to be on the ballot, the candidate must reside in the section, be a property owner and have been a member in good standing for the three years immediately preceding the election. The candidate is required to file a petition with the Elections Chairperson containing five signatures from members in good standing in the section electing a Trustee. Petitions will be available at the Club Office only, Monday through Friday, 9 am to 4 pm, and on Saturdays, 10 am to 1 pm beginning July 3, 2017. The petition must be received at the Club Office at least twenty (20) days before the election, which means no later than 4 pm on Monday, July 31, 2017.

Once the petitions have been certified by the Elections Chairperson, Absentee Ballots will become available. The Absentee Ballot must be received at the Club Office, either by mail or in person, with your validated 2017 Membership Card enclosed in the provided envelope no later than Wednesday, August 16, 2017, at 4 pm.

Elections will be held at the Annual Meeting on August 20. Please make sure that you attend this meeting and that you have your 2017 Membership Card and badge with you.

Highland Lakes Cruises to Second Straight Win

The Highland Lakes Swim Team faced off against the Fayson Lakes Gators in an LSC Week 2, White Division match-up. Highland Lakes anticipated a tough meet, and sure enough, the Gators came out strong in the breaststroke events, evenly splitting the first ten events. Highland Lakes were buoyed by strong performances by the 9/10 boys who swept their event, as well as the 11/12 girls, and both 15/18 breaststroke squads. Fayson led the meet by the end of the breaststroke events, 84-72, leaving Highland Lakes in a position of playing catch-up.

Highland Lakes butterflyers put the team on their shoulders, though, turning a twelve-point deficit into a ten-point lead. The 11/12 girls team impressed, turning in a clean 1-4 sweep, taking maximum points from their event. The 13/14 girls and the 15/18s closed out the butterfly events winning three straight races. The 8/u girls set the tone winning 1st, 2nd, and 4th starting a string of strong performances from the Highland Lakes ladies, who took the majority of the points from each of the 11/12, 13/14, and 15/18 events. Nice work girls! By the end of the backstroke events, HL sat in a stronger 231-203 position, heading into the Freestyle events.

All the leg work swimmers have been putting in during training recently paid off in the freestyle events, with Highland Lakes winning 6 and splitting 1 event, wrangling the Gators into submission. This round, the 9/10 boys and 15/18 boys stood out - sweeping the top three places in both races. The real victory, however, was won by the depth of the team, with 1-3-4 finishes by the 8/u girls and 11/12 boys and girls. By the end of the freestyle events, Highland Lakes held an insurmountable 45-point lead, rendering the relays academic.

Highland Lakes won 7 of the 8 relays anyway, capping off a comprehensive and important in-division victory for

The final score ended 324.5 to 309.5, improving the team’s overall record to 2-0 to start the season.

The team welcomed a number of swimmers into their ranks during this meet. Congratulations are in order to Logan Cole, Derek Flemming, Matthew Antonini, Julie Evanick, Edith Roman, and Regina Brantner, who all made their LSC dual meet debuts. Next week Highland Lakes will welcome division rival Wayne Waves, in hopes of avenging their defeat last season. Meets begin at 7 pm on Wednesday evenings, and the team could really use your support. As it is well known around these parts, “The louder you cheer, the faster they swim!”

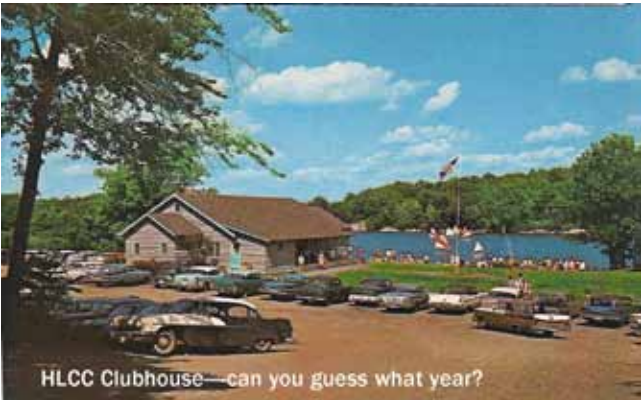

Bounty on Invasive Carp

MICHAEL EWASKO, CHAIRMAN, FISH COMMITTEE

It has come to this committees attention that the invasive Carp species of fish have been spotted in our main lake. Known as Carp, Grass Carp or Koi this species is not native to our waters but have probably been around for some time.

Introduced to American waters during the mid-1800s, bottom-feeding carp quickly become a domineering species in lakes, churning up sediment, uprooting plants and reproducing in mass numbers. It is this concern that has caused the New Jersey Division of Fish & Wildlife to recommend removal of Carp from local lakes and strictly require non-release of Carp caught while fishing. In an effort to improve our fishery the HLCC Fish Committee is offering a bounty on any Carp removed from our lake(s).

The program will run from July 4th to Sept 4th and will be open to children and adults alike. A fishing related prize will be awarded to all verified catches. A cell phone photo or phone call to Michael Ewasko 973-508-2709 or Mark Grammerstorf 845-544-5824 will suffice as verification.

How do you catch a Carp?

There's the challenge. Small fish in stained waters can be easy marks. But most carp are harder to come by, especially for budding carp fans. Big fish can be especially wary, thanks to their longevity and amazing senses of hearing, taste, vision, and feel. Fortunately, there's no shortage of choices in carp baits for effectively targeting carp of all proportions. Carp eat a variety of foods. They favor



insects, aquatic worms, crustaceans, and mollusks, but also consume algae and other plant matter. Due to this diverse diet, a variety of carp baits trip their triggers, from natural offerings to homemade doughbaits and even corn.

As for Carp disposal the recommendation is the same as with any other litter - take it home with you. You can cook them, smoke them or bury them in your garden for the best fertilizer ever! You can of course bag them and put them out with the trash. Just DO NOT leave them along the shore. Good luck to all.

- If the Club needs to remove your boat, *there are significant penalties.*
- **LAKEFRONT OWNERS**, you need to plan to get your boats out of the lake by Labor Day as well. This is especially important if you use a marina to handle your pontoon boat. Same for your docks - if you normally remove docks and floats for the winter, you need to do it before Sept. 15, and that includes contacting whatever contractors you use.

Fishing Corner

Days like this...

When it comes to the impact that approaching thunderstorms have on fishing, it can be a very interesting topic; one in which we will cover next week. On the other hand, a constant heavy rain, rain which brings extreme amounts of run off into our lakes, has the tendency to create somewhat of the opposite effect. The fishing will be phenomenal when the first few storms roll in with the warm summer rain, but if the heavy downpours come back day after day; and the temperatures steadily cool off like they have been after the July 4 weekend; a change of tactics is needed. Try slow rolling a gold Colorado bladed Spinnerbait deep, or looking for areas to fish where heavier amounts of water are running into the lake in one spot. It will create the much needed oxygen that the fish are looking for, since the sediment in the muddy lake is hindering oxygen intake in places. Or, you can grab a few books, a cup of coffee and wait it out for a day or two.
