We all know this has been a long and cold winter, but April is a great month to appreciate the wonders of our earth and especially the environment of Highland Lakes. Earth Day (April 22) has been celebrated since 1970. In honor of this event, Ecology committee members have published several articles suggesting ways for you to learn more about nature and to participate in improving our lakes and forests. In this issue you can read about:

1. The continuation of our discounted Septic Pumping Program. Last year over 150 members benefited from this successful group effort while helping to protect our watershed.

2. Clean-up day scheduled for April 26 where you and your friends can help us remove trash that has been discarded along our roadsides.

3. The Conservation Club (known last year as the Garden Club) which addresses the need to improve

Well, I think that we've made it. Welcome to spring. New business filled the Voting Board's agenda for the regular March meeting. The Board took the following actions:

1. Acceptance of a proposal from Northeast Facility Services of Paramus for road sweeping. Sweeping is scheduled for late April and early May, weather permitting.

2. Acceptance of a 3-year proposal from Allied Biological of NJ, Inc. for lake management services for the years 2014-2016.

3. Acceptance of a proposal from Blue Diamond, Inc. of Succasunna, NJ to extend its contract for ten-weeks of household garbage collection during the summer for five years - 2014-2018.

4. Adoption of the Fiscal Year 2014 Capital Fund budget.

5. Adoption of the Fiscal Year 2014 Capital Fund budget supplement.

6. Adoption of Voting Board Statement on the Use of Certain Pickleball Paddles.

The Voting Board schedule for April shows the workshop on Wednesday, April 9 at 8 pm and the regular meeting on Friday April 25 at 8 pm. The regular meeting is a week later than normal due to the Passover/Easter holidays. Please be advised that our regular meeting agenda affords members two opportunities to address the full Board. Early in the meeting, before the Board takes up New Business, members may address the Board on matters on the agenda. Later in the agenda members may address the Board on any HLCC and CA matters. We will attempt to have agendas available, when possible, at the Club office prior to the regular meeting.

My best wishes for a happy, safe and enjoyable Passover/ Easter holiday. and help maintain many Club-owned properties surrounding our lakes.

4. Forest Management. At our April 10 Ecology meeting (7 pm in the Lakeroom) a licensed forester will discuss the importance of understanding the health of our woodlands, and will suggest ways in which we can help sustain our forests for future generations.

5. The Youth Ecology Stewards (YES) program which is intended to encourage our youth to become more active in improving the quality of our local environment.

6. The danger of deer ticks and how to prevent, recognize and treat Lyme disease. Don't be fooled by the cold weather. These tiny pests are out there now.

The health and beauty of our lake environment needs our personal attention every month of the year, so please make an effort this year to help us guarantee its future.



2014 Badges and Permits

Available for Pickup April 14

Rules and Regulations

The complete Highland Lakes Country Club Rules and Regulations are published on our website at http:/ hlcc.org/members/governance/rules-and-regulations/. It is every member's responsibility to follow these rules for the health, safety and welfare of all members.

In each issue of the Newsette, we'll focus on one or more of those rules and cite the reasons why that rule is so important for all members.

5. All boats must be registered with the Club and have a current Highland Lakes sticker affixed on the exterior bow before use on any of the lakes or the lagoon.

6. All docks must be registered with the Club and display a current Highland Lakes sticker.

The rules about boats and docks pertain to all boats and docks being used on our lakes and lakefronts. The Club does not permit guest boats, only those that are owned by Club members. Every boat and dock must have a sticker, which are not transferable. Rule #6 applies only to lakefront owners and those who surround Lake #1 with docks across Lakeside Drive on the lake.



The Conservation Club of Highland Lakes (CCHL) was formally known as the Garden Club. We have changed the name because some members were confused about the mission and activities of the Garden Club. This volunteer group works on club properties to make them more aesthetically pleasing and more ecologically friendly. So far we have worked on the Freeways around the big lake pruning, planting ground cover, and installing benches. In addition, signs are being removed from trees and relocated onto posts, and new invasive species signs are being installed. We also have created water bars to help control the storm runoff from entering into the lake. For example, at the Shadow


Boat Dock Update

This effort is known as Forest Management. Ron has developed Forest Stewardship Plans for other lake communities in this area and will share his knowledge and experience with us. All club members, club staff, club officers, and voting board members are welcome and encouraged to attend.



High School Volunteers Wanted

Attention high school students... Are you in need of more volunteer hours? Here's a good way to get them. The Ecology Committee is having its annual Clean-Up Day on April 26. You will get documented credit hours by helping clean up the road sides and other Club-owned properties. Hours spent volunteering will help Highland Lakes become more attractive and more ecologically friendly for you, your friends, and your family.

In addition members of the Conservation Club of Highland Lakes will also be at the Clubhouse when you sign-up for Clean-Up Day. Information about the mission and activities of this group of adult volunteers will be provided. This is another opportunity for the youth of Highland Lakes to get involved with nature. Please take a few minutes to read the other articles in this Newsette about Clean-up Day, Youth Ecology Stewardship (YES), and the Conservation Club (CCHL). Remember hours spent working will count towards your needed volunteer hours.

As with all HLCC activities please remember to wear your badge.

Budget

Budgeting for a project can be a 'chicken or egg' dilemma. You can't plan the project until you know how much it will cost, and you can't figure a cost until you know what you are building. Specific cost depends upon materials, amount of work, and other factors. Rules-of-thumb are helpful:

- Demolition: \$25 per square foot
- New construction: \$145/s.f.; wood details,
- ceramic tile, and granite, quickly raise estimates - Deck and railings: treated \$30/s.f.; low-

maintenance material (e.g. Trex decking) \$60/s.f.

Remodeling, rather than adding space, costs can be budgeted by item. Plumbing fixtures run about \$1,650/fixture (which includes removal, piping, moderate-priced fixture and trim). Kitchens are typically big-ticket items -- \$15,000 to \$20,000 plus the cost of the countertop and appliances.

Doing the work yourself may save money. Bear in mind, you will still need to buy materials, which generally run about 50% to 60% of the above estimates.

Highland Lakes Security collected boats from the boat clean up project this past year. Boats were removed from Club property on the west shore of the Main Lake, and from Club property on Lakes 1 and 5. With spring arriving, it is time for owners to retrieve their boats.

All owners claiming a boat must complete this Boat Retrieval Form that is also available from the Security and Main Offices. If this is the year to get your septic system pumped, please complete the following registration form and return it to the club office at your convenience. We suggest pumping your tank every three years. This simple and inexpensive action on your part will not only help protect our lake watershed, but will increase the life of your septic system.

A few weeks after submitting your application David Zuidema's office will contact you directly to schedule an appointment. Their number is 1-888-901-7392, but to get the discount, you must submit your application form to the club office. If you have a standard, easily accessible, 1,000 gallon tank the discounted price will be \$150 plus NJ sales tax. To obtain this price you (or vour personally named representative):

1. Must be available to meet with the pumper at your house during normal business hours

2. Must know where your tank is located

3. Must not require digging services by the pumper to access the tank lid. (Extra charges will apply for any digging services)

4. Must be prepared to pay the driver directly upon successful completion of the job.

Note: There may be additional charges for pumping tanks that are difficult to locate or hard to pump due to steep or rough terrain near your tank. Also, if it is recommended by the driver that your septic system is in need of any repairs, those repairs would not be included in the discounted pumping price. When the driver arrives, and before any pumping begins, we recommend that you discuss your specific situation with the driver.

We feel certain that David's people will treat you fairly and honestly; however, in the unlikely event that you have any concerns, please feel free to contact me directly at 973 764-6869. Based on the pleasant experiences of those who participated last year, I do not expect many phone calls.

Pickleball Paddles Soften Sound

The growth of pickleball in Highland Lakes has created opportunities for all of us to learn more about this exciting sport. In this process we have learned that quieter paddles can be used without reducing the fun of the game and the play of the paddles. As a result, HLCC has instituted two new regulations regarding the use of paddles.

The first is that all paddles purchased for use on HLCC pickle ball courts must be selected from the Sun City Grand "Green Zone" paddle list that can be found at this website: http://pball.grandpickleball.org/paddlerule.pdf. These paddles were tested by Acoustics Group, Inc. and found to be the quietest paddles on the market. The only paddles approved in addition to those on this list are the "Venom" by Pickleball Specialties (http://www.pickleballspecialties. com/) and the "Vortex".

In order that Club members can try some of these "Green Zone" paddles, the Club has purchased five that were recommended by Pickleball Central, one of the leading suppliers of pickle ball equipment. These demo paddles will be available in early spring when pickleball resumes on Sunday mornings from 9 am -12 pm, and Monday and Tuesday evenings from 6 pm - 8 pm.

The other regulation is that paddles previously purchased by members that are not in the "Green Zone" list will have to be dampened with "quiet pickleball pads" which will be supplied by HLCC. These pads, when tested by HLCC members, were found to significantly reduce the noise of the ball striking the paddle without affecting the play of the paddle. If you have purchased one or more paddles prior to 1/1/14, please contact Bill Beardsley by email (trustee2@hlcc.org) or phone at (973) 764-7730.

If you are interested, Pickleball Central is offering members of the Highland Lakes community a five percent discount on all purchases. An additional five percent will be deposited in the Club account which will then be used to make future purchases of equipment for the Club. You simply have to give Pickleball Central (http:// pickleballcentral.com/) the Club membership code, *HL Pickleball*, when making your purchase.



The Sailing Fleets of Highland Lakes

We are fortunate to have five active sailing fleets in Highland Lakes- Sunfish, Force 5, Flying Junior, Windsurfer and Catamaran. The boats sailed represent different experiences for those

interested in sailing. In order to help members find out which boat best fits the needs and wants of your desired sailing experience, here are the fleets:

Highland Lakes Fleet is #23 with the International Sunfish Class (http://www. sunfishclass.org)

13.9 feet. Sunfish have one sail and are raced either with one or two sailors. Current builder: Laser Performance in Rhode Island. The Sunfish is the most popular recreational sailboat in history. Its classic design, unmatched

stability and sailing ease are enjoyed by all ages. Owners appreciate the lightweight hull, which easily travels on the top of a car. The ultra-durable construction ensures years of maintenance-free enjoyment. Sailing trips are a breeze; just load the Sunfish on your car and go!

This is the classic boat you grew up with. The Sunfish has two easy-to-rig lines and easy-snap sail rings. A racing Sunfish can have an outhaul, Cunningham, race-sail with window and quick-release gooseneck upgrades. The International Sunfish Class sanctions more than 1,000 racing events each year. In Highland Lakes, we sail three fleets of Sunfish; Juniors-Single (under 19) Junior skipper on Wednesdays, Junior-Doubles (two under 19) on Fridays, Ladies (Over 19) as a singles race, and Seniors on Sundays for men and women over 19 years of age. We also are part of the SANJL association (Sailing Association of North Jersey Lakes) that holds four regattas each year at various lakes. We host one of the SANJL regattas yearly and in various years have held the prestigious SANJL Junior Championship Regatta.

Highland Lakes Fleet is Fleet #5 with the Force 5 Class. (http://force5.us/ main)

The Force 5 is a small one-design racing sailboat that is similar to the more well known Laser but with a hard chine aft. Although it is designed for single-handed racing, two people can easily fit into the large cockpit. The boats are currently built in Long Island, New York by Weeks Yacht Yard. This is a competitive, sleek boat that

is sensitive to the wind making for exciting sailing. This 14-foot craft has a 91-foot mainsail, rolled deck and an adjustable rig. It can be car topped. Force 5 races are held Saturdays at 11 am from the Eckardt Sailing Center.

The Flying Junior Fleet started in 2012. (http://www. cficlass.org) The current builder is Laser Performance in Rhode Island. The club Flying Junior (aka FJ) is a tough, agile performer for beginners to elite sailors. The FJ is a fantastic choice for clubs and junior programs looking to introduce young and less seasoned sailors to double-handed sailing with a spinnaker. The collegiate version of the FJ (no spinnaker) is the most popular boat in college sailing and is the type we sail

in Highland Lakes; more collegiate sailing teams in North America sail FJs than any other double-handed sailboat. The Highland Lakes FJ races are sailed on Sundays with two races starting at 11am. Come enjoy this growing energetic fun fleet.

Windsurfers are simple in design – one board, one sail, and one sailor. The lightweight foam core boards also make for a quick and painless transport to your favorite launch site. Loading and unloading can easily be done by one person. Manufacturers produce everything from stable beginner designs with stand up paddle options to planning hull race boards.

We utilize two basic classes for racing – Sport and Open. The Sport Class is

designed for beginner to novice racers. Pre-race clinics are available by calling 764-2125 by 11am on race days. Races are on Saturdays at 3pm starting on June 28. The maximum allowed sail sizes for racing are 9.3 square meters for the Open Class and 7.5 square meters for the Sport Class. Both classes can use any type manufacturer board and sail. U.S.Windsurfing sanctioned events run throughout the year at various locations with points counting toward national rankings at the end of each year. Classes include Open, Formula, Kona One Design and Hybrid which includes the Neil Pryde Olympic class RS:X.

Catamarans - The largest number of Catamarans on the lake are made by Hobie. The two types are the 16 and the Wave. The 16's hulls are made of fiberglass, have 2 sails with 20 meters of sail area, a 27 foot mast, and weigh 320 pounds. The Wave's hulls are made of rotomoulded polyethylene, have one 9 meter sail, a 20 foot mast, and weigh 245 pounds. The 16 is a higher performance boat better suited for racing. The Wave is more of a recreational boat

and doesn't go upwind as well as the 16. Both are fun boats especially in higher wind. We sail Sundays at 11 with the FJ's so come join us if can. We'd love more of you to join in! Let's show all how these big boats fly!
