An Event You Won't Want to Miss

The Highland Lakes Community Yard Sale is now in its sixth year. The event is scheduled to take place on Saturday, July 19, with doors opening at 8 am until 2 pm that afternoon. As is the case with any successful event, the work begins long before and involves many within our community.

Just as the enthusiasm for the yard sale grows with every year, so does the level of involvement from within our community. At our first planning meeting this spring we welcomed committee members who have been involved since the event was conceived in 2009 as well as new members with fresh ideas. Together we've planned an event that is expected to bring enjoyment to visitors of all ages and interests.

For those within the Highland Lakes community who are eager to clear their closets, basement, garage, tool shed, play room, etc., you are encouraged to drop off all items that are in good working order to the HL Clubhouse between 8 am and 5 pm on Friday, July 18. (You will find a list of items that you can donate as well as a list of those that we cannot accept in this issue of the Newsette.) Committee members will be available to check the item in, price it and situate it with other similar items so that it is ready and waiting when the sale begins early the next day.

We never know what will be coming through the door that Friday, but one thing is certain: We receive a lot of donations! These items always fill the Seckler Room of the clubhouse and often spill out onto the lawn where private vendor tables can also be found. Between these vendor tables and the donated items, the assortment of goods available for sale is simply amazing. Tools, children's toys and Highland Lakes memorabilia sell almost as soon as our doors open on Saturday, but everything from kitchen items to purses, jewelry, pottery donated from a local artist, fine dishes and flatware, picture frames, books, CDs, furniture, beach chairs... seems to find a new home by the time the event comes to a close at 2 pm.

Throughout the day baked goods are on sale (thanks to

the efforts of the HL Women's Club and other community members) and the grill is fired up early. Even if you don't find a treasure or a bargain (it's nearly impossible to believe this could happen) you are assured of a day filled with community spirit and that is really what got this whole thing started six years ago.

The HL Community Yard Sale was organized to raise money to support the Goodwill Fund. Established in 2005. This fund is dedicated to helping people in our community who are facing financial hardships due to a catastrophic event or series of smaller events that have made life very difficult. No one can predict when this may happen. Despite this reality, the operational expenses and maintenance of our Club requires that annual membership dues be paid by every member. These dues and assessments are mandatory regardless of any member's personal situation. The Goodwill Fund is our community's way of lending compassionate, anonymous and temporary assistance to our neighbors by alleviating their need to pay their annual Club dues for one year. The member's dues instead are paid with money from the fund. This year we helped twelve families.

Undertaking A Home Improvement Project Hiring Contractors (part 3 of 6)

Some contractors may prefer charging time and materials (T&M) for a project, others may offer a fixed price. A T&M approach may make it easier to modify the scope, and facilitate the contractor's ability to respond to the unexpected. On the other hand, you may feel that the work is progressing too slowly, as there seems to be no incentive for the contractor to finish. A firm contract price successfully locks in a price, but you may feel that the contractor is rushing and cutting corners to make a greater profit.

Either approach may be suitable for your project. Whatever course you take, allow a fair profit for the contractor. If the contractor starts the project, but can't afford to finish, what is the value of a great price if the work is never completed?

If you are bidding the work, request pricing in a comparable format. Ask for a total price as well as the cost for discrete elements. These prices can help you compare pricing and understand progress. Ask for a payment schedule. Don't agree to make too large an initial payment; frequent smaller payments are better than fewer large payments. Whatever you agree, pay promptly. Check references for the contractor(s)!

Boat Dock News

KEN BOSCHERT, CHAIRMAN, BOAT DOCK COMMITTEE

Those members who were on the waiting lists for dock space will be assigned shortly as those members who did not have their boats in their assigned location or did not notify the boat dock committee by July 7th have forfeited their assigned space. Members are reminded that an application must be completed and you must be assigned a dock space prior to placing a boat at a club dock.

All boats located on club property, racks, freeways and all docks must be stored properly or be subject to removal and assessments in accordance with the association by-laws. All boats must display current membership boating stickers on both sides of the bow. Racks, docks, and assigned slips must have a current boating sticker placed on each space utilized by the member. Failure to have current boating stickers, as required, may make the member's boat subject to removal as well as elimination from the spring boat dock lottery system.

Please note that only the marina docks are on an assigned basis. These docks are located at Club Park, Comet Row, Beaches #3 & #4, and Eckhart Sailing Center. All other freeway docks are on a first come, first serve basis. For those members not assigned a space, other docks and racks

are available at most freeway locations around the main lake.

We ask that members keep their boats upside down on the club racks and docks and remove drain plugs so they do not fill with rain water and cause damage to facilities provided. We also ask that you bail excess water out of boats when it accumulates.

The Livery Boat program is available once again this year for the use of all members in good standing. Please bring your membership card, badge, and one other means of personal identification when checking out the boats at the activity center. All equipment will be given to you once the boats are properly signed out. The boats are located on the south side of Beach 2 and are free to all members. Please wear all Personal Flotation Devices (PFD's) when using the club boats.

Lastly, please note that there is a width restriction to any boat assigned a space on the marina docks. We must be able to place boats side-by-side in these locations. Members with oversized boats will be asked to relocate to one of the two freeway docks at Comet Row, which can accommodate larger vessels such as pontoon boats and larger sailboats.

Club Beach Rules

*Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had any signs or symptoms of a gastrointestinal (stomach) disease in the past seven days.

*All children in diapers must wear plastic pants with snug fitting elastic waist and leg bands. Do not wash out soiled diapers in the bathing water.

*Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Immediately report any "accidents" you observe in the bathing waters to a lifeguard.

*No animals, except for service animals, shall be allowed in the swimming pool, wading pool, hot tub, or spa area, dressing rooms, or other parts of the enclosure.

*Glass containers shall be prohibited in food and drink areas.

*Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others shall be prohibited.

*Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm.

*Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the water.

*No motorized vehicles, except emergency and maintenance vehicles shall be permitted in the bathing area during its use.

*No boating, water skiing, sailboating, windsurfing, scuba diving, or surfboarding shall be permitted in the swimming and bathing area while in use.

*Rope drops shall not be permitted except those licensed and inspected by the Department of Community Affairs pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:3-31 through 55.



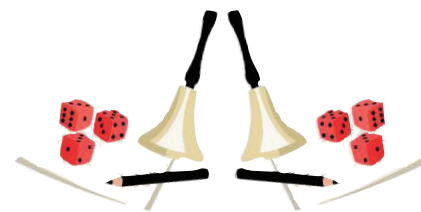
Petitions for Trustee Positions Available

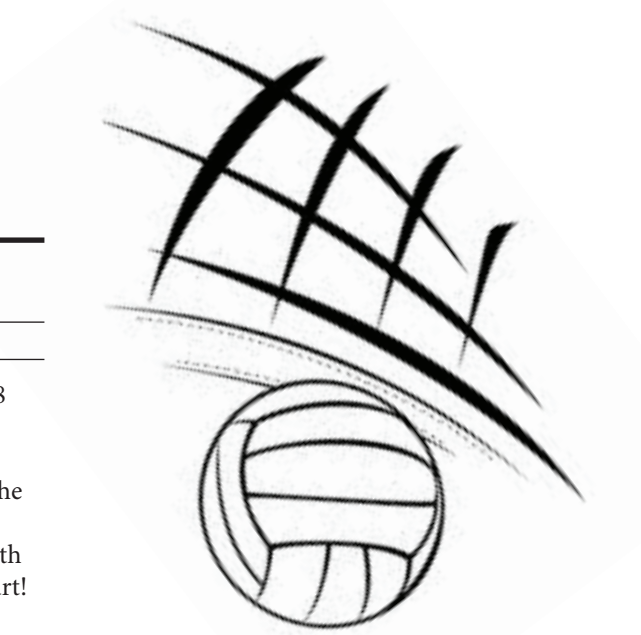
