Swing and French Jazz Coming to Highland Lakes

Bonjour et bonne nouvelles, les amateurs de musique! The modern day ambassadors of classic Parisian swing are coming to Seckler Stage. Singer Tatiana Eva-Marie (who the Wall Street Journal recently hailed as "one of the best young singers around") and the Avalon Jazz Band are bringing their repertoire of timeless American standards and French jazz songs to Highland Lakes on September 12.

The Avalon Jazz Band's performances meld Parisian and Golden Age swing spirit, taking music lovers on a ride back

Club Beach Rules

- Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had any signs or symptoms of a gastrointestinal (stomach) disease in the past seven days.
- All children in diapers must wear plastic pants with snug fitting elastic waist and leg bands. Do not wash out soiled diapers in the bathing water.
- Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Immediately report any "accidents" you observe in the bathing waters to a lifeguard.
- No animals, except for service animals, shall be allowed in the swimming pool, wading pool, hot tub, or spa area, dressing rooms, or other parts of the enclosure.
- Glass containers shall be prohibited in food and drink areas.
- Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others shall be prohibited.
- Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm.
- Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the water.

- No motorized vehicles, except emergency and maintenance vehicles shall be permitted in the bathing area during its use.
- No boating, water skiing, sailboating, windsurfing, scuba diving, or surfboarding shall be permitted in the swimming and bathing area while in use.
- Rope drops shall not be permitted except those licensed and inspected by the Department of Community Affairs pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:3-31 through 55.

Beach Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent fecal coliform testing at the Club's beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and a beach must be closed if the results of consecutive tests exceed 200. Testing results are reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.



Reptiles, lizards, snakes, frogs and even an alligator will bring a reptile show that is sure to please.









Septic Tank Pumping Discount Program

The Ecology Committee of Highland Lakes is happy to announce that our very successful and popular group pumping discount program offered by David Zuidema will continue in 2014. If this is the year to get your septic system pumped, please complete the following registration form and return it to the club office at your convenience. We suggest pumping your tank every three years. This simple and inexpensive action on your part will not only help protect our lake watershed, but will increase the life of your septic system.

A few weeks after submitting your application David Zuidema's office will contact you directly to schedule an appointment. Their number is 1-888-901-7392, but to get the discount, you must submit your application form to the club office. If you have a standard, easily accessible, 1,000 gallon tank the discounted price will be \$150 plus NJ sales tax. To obtain this price you (or your personally named representative):

- 1. Must be available to meet with the pumper at your house during normal business hours
- 2. Must know where your tank is located
- 3. Must not require digging services by the pumper to access the tank lid. (Extra charges will apply for any digging services)
- 4. Must be prepared to pay the driver directly upon successful completion of the job.

Note: There may be additional charges for pumping tanks that are difficult to locate or hard to pump due to steep or rough terrain near your tank. Also, if it is recommended by the driver that your septic system is in need of any repairs, those repairs would not be included in the discounted pumping price. When the driver arrives, and before any pumping begins, we recommend that you discuss your specific situation with the driver.

We feel certain that David's people will treat you fairly and honestly; however, in the unlikely event that you have any concerns, please feel free to contact me directly at 973 764-6869. Based on the pleasant experiences of those who participated last year, I do not expect many phone calls.

Thanks again for helping to keep our lakes clean.

Undertaking A Home Improvement Project Completion (part 6 of 6)

Owners have found it helpful to take photographs before and during progress of the project. These provide a record of project conditions, and can be useful in locating items once walls are closed. Many owners create on-line photo albums and share the project with friends and relatives via the web. It is nice to have a "before and after" record.

As you near completion make a check list of outstanding work. Go over it with the contractor and discuss when the work will be completed.

Sometimes additional work is scheduled after the final inspection. Make sure this work is completed to your satisfaction. Ask the contractor for all manuals and special tools that may be included with installed appliances. When the contract is complete (you have received an approval for the final inspection and all work has been completed), meet with the contractor. The last ten percent of the contractor's fee should be due at this point. Tell them what you thought of their work and areas where you were happy and disappointed. Let them know if you can be a reference. Pay the contractor promptly and enjoy your newly renovated space in Highland Lakes!





Sr. Sunfish Race Results

Since I was off celebrating my birthday and not enjoying our HLCC good sailing winds and weather, I thought some general information about the history of the Sunfish Sailboat would be of interest. In the 1940s, Cortlandt Heyniger and Alex Byran created a company. They used their names to form Alcort, the company name. Alcort's first sailboat was the Sailfish. Introduced in 1945 according to The Sunfish Bible by Will White, it was similar to a large wooden surfboard with a sail, a rudder and a dagger board. The class became popular for racing in the 1960s and 1970s. In 1972 the boat employed a new rudder design—its current rudder attachment—switching to that would not release under sailing strain.

The Highland Lakes Triangle
