Family Day was revived as an annual tradition for the club's 50th anniversary and rejuvenated by the hard work of the Women's Auxiliary group, helping make it the fun-filled day we look forward to every year. Family Day was overseen by Eileen Opfer for a number of years before she handed over the reins to Carol Hastie in 1990, who has run it ever since. When asked about her experience with the event, Carol said that each year it's important to try something new in terms of themes and events, but some things never change (Make Your Own Ice Cream Sundae continues to

be a big hit.) One of Carol's favorite memories from previous Family Days is of Joe Mastrangelo, now passed. He was wearing a hat he made and leading the children along the clubhouse grounds in a parade. Carol remarked, "That tells me that the day is for everyone to enjoy and to participate in."

Family Day is truly a day for the dedicated volunteers and members of our club to relax, enjoy, and catch up. Volunteers are always welcomed and needed to help host the day and support Clubhouse Staff. Members are encouraged to wear their badges, bring a chair and enjoy spending the day with your HL family. chrisharford.com and www.facebook.com/BandofChanges) comes at you with unmistakable immediacy thanks to throaty vocals that draw you into his woody, roots-oriented compositions, and his band’s tastefully understated musical chops.

The band’s latest record, “Lay the Passage: Songs for the Antediluvian” is an entrancing 16-song collection that leans predominantly more toward acoustic campfire ballads than barn-fire rockers, but Harford and his bandmates handle it all with enthusiasm and a refreshing sense of spontaneity. Along with Harford, the July 25 lineup of Band of Changes will feature Mickey Melchiondo (aka Dean Ween), Dave Dreiwitz (Ween, Sparklehorse), and Joe Russo (Further w/ Phil Lesh and Bob Weir).

HL: You’re an accomplished singer/songwriter as well as an acclaimed painter. Is there anything you aren’t good at? Do you consciously put on different hats when the muse starts whispering in your ear?

Harford: I didn’t always change hats, but now that I’m older I need to make decisions about my approach, and put deadlines in place. The way my life goes now, everything has to be compartmentalized. I give myself time

each month to write music, I paint in a rush before shows, and try to work a regular job when I’m not playing music or painting. Painting is my peaceful time, and music is something I do with other people, but I’m not too good at general life skills. I can’t get my marketing and accounting skills together whatsoever, and they’re both important ingredients on top of me always striving to be a better human being in general.

HL: How large is the current pool of musicians in Band of Changes?

Harford: It’s currently around 200 different musicians, which is really quite extraordinary. For example, this past Saturday I had gig down in Frenchtown, NJ. On that night my band included a drummer named Jim Hines. I had never heard him play before, but he tours with Brian Wilson from the Beach Boys, so I had to assume he can play. The keyboard player that night was George Laks, who has played with Lenny Kravitz for 20 years. Basically, friends will tell me about a musician, and if I like what I hear I’ll ask them to participate. I enjoy it when the band meets for first time on stage. Everyone is an accomplished player, and I’ve been doing some of these songs for a long time, so these new musicians come in and bring an original take. It can be a recipe for a train wreck, but most of the time it’s magical.

Club Beach Rules

- Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had any signs or symptoms of a gastrointestinal (stomach) disease in the past seven days.
- All children in diapers must wear plastic pants with snug fitting elastic waist and leg bands. Do not wash out soiled diapers in the bathing water.
- Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Immediately report any “accidents” you observe in the bathing waters to a lifeguard.
- No animals, except for service animals, shall be allowed in the swimming pool, wading pool, hot tub, or spa area, dressing rooms, or other parts of the enclosure.
- Glass containers shall be prohibited in food and drink areas.
- Conduct which endangers the safety and comfort of others shall be prohibited.
- Outdoor bathing shall be prohibited during an electrical storm.
- Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be prohibited from entering the water.
- No motorized vehicles, except emergency and maintenance vehicles shall be permitted in the bathing area during its use.
- No boating, water skiing, sailboating, windsurfing, scuba diving, or surfboarding shall be permitted in the swimming and bathing area while in use.
- Rope drops shall not be permitted except those licensed and inspected by the Department of Community Affairs pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:3-31 through 55.

Beach Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent fecal coliform testing at the Club’s beaches and swim lanes performed by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and a beach must be closed if the results of consecutive tests exceed 200. Testing results are reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.

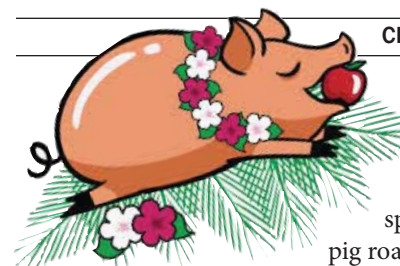

Boat Dock Committee News

KEN BOSCHERT, CHAIRMAN, BOAT DOCK COMMITTEE

All members are required to place current boating stickers on assigned dock spaces and on both sides of the bow of the boat to be stored on club property. All boating stickers must have the assigned membership number displayed at all times. Failure to have a current membership boating permit with assigned member number may cause the boat to be removed from the club property and subject the owner to the rules and the imposition of a special assessment to the club.

All members must complete an application, submit the completed application, and be assigned a space before placing their boats on assigned dock spaces. The assigned lottery dock space is not transferable from one member to another. No member shall place their boat on any other space which is not properly assigned to them by the boat dock committee.

Freeway spaces, dock spaces and boat racks are available on all of the lakes to all members in good standing on a first-come, first-serve basis. There are no assignments nor are there any reserved spaces at these freeway and rack locations. Only those spaces without the current year's dock sticker are open and available to the membership. As a reminder, the only

requirement for the use of all freeway docks and racks is that the member is required to display the current boating permit on the dock space or rack, as well as on both sides of the bow of the watercraft using the space.

All boats located on freeway dock spaces and boat racks shall be stored properly. No boat shall be permanently moored or secured to the offshore end of ANY club dock or freeway location. The offshore end of the dock is to be used by members to temporarily load and unload personal equipment from their boats and must be vacated when this is completed. The offshore end of all club docks and freeways MUST be left accessible for the use of Emergency Personnel at all times.

Many assigned club dock spaces are full and others are underutilized. Club Park still has rack space as well as open spaces available for assignment and use. If you can utilize another docking area please advise us by submitting your application indicating your first, second, third or fourth choice on your completed application. This will assist with having your watercraft on the lake.

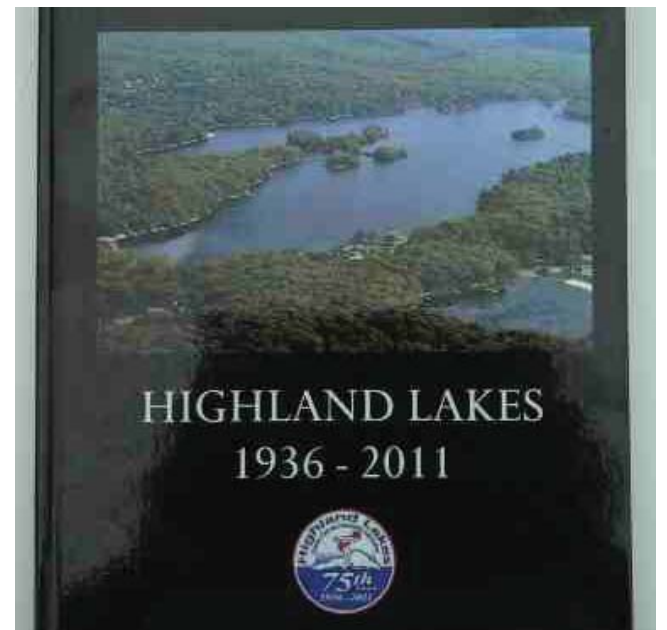

Undertaking A Home Improvement Project Construction (part 5 of 6)

Prior to commencing work, reconfirm the timing and budget with all parties. Have a schedule, identify the order items are to be undertaken, when decisions and inspections are required, and when payments are due.

Work in Highland Lakes can be completed throughout the year. Contractors may be more readily available in the so called 'off season.' Weather can be harsh on the mountain; snow and rain can slow or stop a project and/or cause additional costs.

Don't stand in the way of progress. If you are providing materials, make sure they are on-site when needed – not early or late. Some items may have a long lead time (windows, cabinets, hardware); make sure they are ordered so you don't delay progress. And if you are responsible for preparation, such as moving furniture or demolition, make sure your work is completed when promised.

If you are the GC, know when permit inspections are required, (footings, plumbing, electric, mechanical, framing, insulation, fire protection, and final). Missing an inspection can result in work being slowed or worse, requiring walls to be reopened for inspection, rebuilding work, or replacement of equipment.

Sr. Sunfish Race Results

Seven Sr. Sunfish sailors enjoyed a sunny 79 degree July Sunday afternoon on Highland Lakes. However, the 7 mph shifting winds from north to southwest made it a difficult start. Sue Buruchian and I agreed to change the course from #3 to #1 white/white/red buoys just before the start due to this wind shift. The variable winds caused some confusion at the start and five of the seven sailors were over the line causing a general recall and a restart with a repeat of our 3 minute countdown series. Unfortunately Mladen was over the line on the restart and he had to restart a second time. Thank you Sue and my wife Linda for “volunteering” to be our dock committee in Allan and Brett’s absence. Also, thank you to lifeguards Steve Castiglione and Matt Montero for giving us that safe feeling.

Mark Buruchian continued his winning ways by placing first in front of Bob Tomsey, me and Lou Iannucci who changed places several times sailing to the finish line. At times, the wind was strong enough for the gooseneck position on the boom to make a difference. Most sailors like to adjust it according to wind conditions, moving it

forward in light air - as close as 12 inches from the tack with the older sails – and aft as the wind picks up. According to “The Sunfish Bible” 14 to 14 ½ inches from the boom is considered pretty extreme, with the consensus at about 16 inches. In really heavy stuff, the boom will be carried practically parallel to the deck. With the gooseneck forward, the boat can be pointed higher, but it’s harder to keep the boat “in the groove” – moving well without stalling. Try adjusting your gooseneck according to the wind conditions, you may feel and enjoy the difference.

Please take notice that we plan to have two races next week if the weather and winds allow. Also if you have not picked up your 2014 Sr. Sunfish T-Shirt, they will be available at the starting dock every Sunday before our 2:30 pm start. Feel free to give me a call to pick up your T-Shirt at my home as well.
