Beach Water Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing performed at the Club's beaches and swim lanes by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliters. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.



Babe Ruth League Reunion Game





Hello, everyone! I certainly hope you're doing well and keeping cool in this oppressive heat and humidity. Perhaps you've spoken a few expletives about the weather or your AC if it isn't working. Understandable...I guess, but let me share something with you by Monica LaRose entitled TAKING RESPONSIBILITY FOR WORDS.

It's almost unheard of for institutions to admit guilt after a tragedy. But one year after a 17-year-old student's death, a prestigious school admitted it "fell tragically short" in protecting him. The student had been relentlessly bullied, and school leaders, despite knowing about his mistreatment, did little to protect him. The school has now committed to taking significant steps to combat bullying and better care for students' mental health.

The devastation caused by bullying is a stark example of the power of words. Do we take the impact of words lightly? Cruel words can really injure.

How do we bring life to what we say? Our words flow from either wisdom or foolishness.

We all have a responsibility - in words and in actions- to

take seriously the impact of words, whether at meetings, casual gatherings, daily activities, etc. Let's care for and protect those wounded by what others have said. Words can kill, but compassionate words can also heal, becoming a tree of life branching out to those around us. Measure what you say, don't speak falsely in heated moments, and know that you, too, make mistakes. Own up to these mistakes and correct them.



Swim Team Wins Back to Back Meets to Claim White Division Title

Inclement weather forced the Swim Team to reschedule their Week 3 dual meet versus Erskine Lakes, setting up a Week 4 gauntlet. Back-to-back meets on two successive nights versus Erskine and Green Pond would essentially decide this season's LSC White Division champion. The task was set for the team: win both meets and win the division!

Tuesday, July 23rd- Erskine Lakes at HL

First up, on Tuesday evening, Erskine Lakes Aquatic Club traveled to Highland Lakes to make-up the postponed Week 3 contest. ELAC defeated Green Pond during their Week 2 meet by a narrow margin, placing them level with Highland Lakes in the White Division standings. A win for either team would put the victor in pole position for the division title. Highland Lakes swimmers brought their best to the lanes on Tuesday night, and impressed throughout their home opener.

Highland Lakes opened up a commanding 89-67 lead through the breaststroke events, winning eight of the ten contests. Stand out performances included the 13/14 Girls team of Adrienn Kovacs, Alicia Kovacs, and Isabella Cherichella, who turned in a 1-2-4 result, matched by the 15/18 Boys team of James Brantner, Sean Allen-Poole, and Colin Dignan who also went 1-2-4. While the butterfly events were evenly split with both teams winning four contests, HL was able to extend their lead through a pair of 1-2-3 "sweeps" by the 11/12 Boys and 15/18 Girls. The 11/12 Boys squad of Chace Puccio, Caleb Burns, and Ryan Allen-Poole took maximum points, while the 15/18 Girls squad put a marker down with a clean 1-4 sweep of the event thanks to Abbey Amato, Alexandra Kovacs, Hannah Wisniewski, and Mia Chonko.

In the backstroke events, HL claimed five wins and one draw from the ten contests. The 13/14 Boys squad of Derek Fleming, Caleb Dalelio, and Braeden Contreni finished 1-2-3, while the 15/18 Girls turned in another 1-4 sweep thanks to Kovacs, Wisniewski, Jenna Brennan, and Gabriella Cefaloni. Freestyle events followed the backstroke events, with similar results. HL claimed five outright wins and two draws in the discipline. Highlights included the 11/12 Girls team of Alexa Fleming, Zoey Levens, Rebecca Cefaloni, and Makenzie Getch who finished 1-2-3-4. The relay events cemented Highland Lakes' victory as the relay teams won six of the eight team races. By the end of the evening, Highland Lakes claimed an important victory with the meet finishing with a final score of HL 373- EL 301.

Wednesday, July 24th- Green Pond at HL

Highland Lakes swimmers had to rest up and run it back for a second night in a row. The team entered Wednesday night buoyed by their win the night before, but knew that a tough Green Pond Mussels team would not go down easily. Having defeated Highland Lakes last season to claim the White Division, this meet was an opportunity for some payback. The weather gods, however, would insist on having their say for a second straight week. Storms threatened as the meet start time approached, with the radar showing a direct hit was on its way. The meet began in haste, with everyone in attendance crossing their fingers and hoping for

the best. Heavy rains commenced during the breaststroke events and lasted through the butterfly events, challenging swimmers to bring their best in less-than-ideal conditions.

Highland Lakes breaststrokers continued their impressive form, opening the meet with six wins and one draw. The 15/18 Girls team of Abbey Amato, Hannah Wisniewski, and Gabriella Cefaloni were the top point-scorers of the group, winning their race with a 1-2-4 finish. The 11/12 Boys, 13/14 Girls, and 15/18 Boys teams also won big with 1-3-4 results. By the end of the Breaststroke events, HL built a solid 85-69 lead. With five wins from the eight butterfly events, they were able to grow their lead to a 22-point spread. The top performance came from the 13/14 Boys duo of Vincent Fisher and Derek Fleming, who finished 1-2 in their contest. The meet stood at 148-126 by the start of the backstroke events.

The Mussels staged an impressive comeback in the backstroke discipline. Racking up three wins and a draw from the first four contests, they nearly erased HL's lead entirely. The meet stood at 170-168 after the 9/10 Girls Backstroke contest. A critical 1-2-3-4 sweep by the 11/12 boys' team of Derek Fisher, Joseph Evanick, Ryan Allen-Poole, and Gavin Kiefer was an important counterpunch after HL found themselves on the ropes. The 13/14 Boys team of Derek Fleming, Caleb Dalelio, and Braeden Contreni also posted a 1-2-3 result in the backstroke. By the end of the backstroke events, HL held onto a tenuous 222-211 lead.

The Green Pond 8/U boys team opened the freestyle events with a sweep of their own to bring the score to a single point gap - HL 225, GP 224. Three events later, Green Pond moved into their first lead of the night, with another sweep taking them into a three-point lead. Highland Lakes won the next four contests to jump out to a 24-point lead. The run was capped off by a big 1-2-3 sweep by the 13/14 Girls squad of Adrienn Kovacs, Isabella Cherichella, and Eva D. The freestyle events ended with HL holding onto a 305-287 lead. The relays would decide the contest. Green Pond could win the meet if they won five or more of the relay events. Critically, Green Pond did not field two relays, costing them essential points at the end of the meet. Highland Lakes' relays were able to hold Green Pond's teams off with an even 4-4 split of the events. Wins by the 8/U Relay, Boys 11/12, Boys 13/14, and Girls 13/14 teams ensured victory for Highland Lakes!

The fans who braved the weather cheered as the scoring booth announced the final score: HL 353- GP 327! The Highland Lakes coaching staff celebrated the hard-earned win with a swim of their own, diving off the 25-meter pier while the swimmers cheered them on! The victory meant Highland Lakes would finish as the Undefeated White Division Champions for the 2024 Season. The team still has two non-division meets left on their regular season schedule. Please join us for our final home meet of the season on Wednesday, August 7 when we'll bid farewell to our graduating seniors!

History in the Making: Three Swim Team Records Broken

The Highland Lakes Swim Team has kept team records since its inception. To lay claim to a team record is a historic achievement! In my ten years as Head Coach, we've handed out "Record Breaker" awards a total of 15 times. They tend to come in small batches of 2-3 per year, but in other years, no new records are set. Generations of Swim Team participants have studied the records after practice, posted under the clubhouse deck on an unassuming corkboard, with dreams of one day seeing their own name on the record report. I am excited to report that 2024 has already seen three records broken to date! The two athletes that set these records deserve some special recognition!

On Saturday July 20, while competing at the Pequannock Invitational, Maeve Olsen turned in not one but TWO record-breaking performances. The first record to fall was previously set by Joette Fiorello in August of 1987; her time of 50.30 stood for 37 years as the fastest 8 & Under Girls Breaststroke performance. Maeve lowered the record by over half a second to 49.58!

The second record claimed by Maeve is a story unto itself! The oldest individual records on the board are still held by Tina Weller. In August of 1976, Miss Weller set both the 8&U Girls Backstroke and Freestyle records. The records stood undisturbed for 47 years - a remarkable duration. As a student of the team's history, the freestyle record of 39.10, in particular, has always stood out to me as one that, frankly,

felt unbreakable. Part of me even doubted the validity of the record - it seemed almost unfathomably fast for an 8-year-old to be under 40 seconds in the 50-meter freestyle! Teammates who swam with Tina assured me it was the real deal, but I still quietly had my doubts - a handwriting error or transposed digit must surely be the reason for such an eye-watering time. As the saying goes, however, records are made to be broken. This record wasn't just broken, though; it was SMASHED. Maeve's new record of 37.86 is a full 1.24 seconds below the old mark. For a record to stand nearly 50 years only to be smashed by over a full second is truly incredible. I'd wager Maeve's record will stand for over 50 years! We'll check back in 2075! Congratulations, Maeve, on an amazing double-record day!

Finally, during Saturday's Highland "B" Invitational, the third record of the 2024 season was set. In the Open 50M Breaststroke final, Abbey Amato lowered her own 15/18 Girls 50M Breaststroke record that she set last season. She cruised to a new Highland Lakes record of 36.00. Abbey is no stranger to the record board, appearing a total of three times! Congratulations Abbey! We'll all be urging you on as you try to take the record into the 35.00 territory!

Congratulations to both Maeve and Abbey on their historic performances! Your names and times will be the motivating force for girls on the team for years to come!
