

Beach Water Testing Results

Below are the results of the most recent E. coli testing performed at the Club's beaches and swim lanes by Garden State Laboratories, Inc. Weekly tests are required by the State of New Jersey, and results must not exceed 320 organisms per 100 milliliters. All samples conformed to NJ State recreational bathing standards. Testing results are also reported by the lab to the Sussex County Department of Health.



Swim Team Wins High-Point Trophy at "A" Championships

August 11

The Highland Lakes Swim Team collected its second major LSC trophy of the season, to bring the 2024 season count up to a total of five trophies! The team earned the 2024 LSC White Division High Point award at the league's finale "A" Championships meet. This is the third season in a row that Highland Lakes won the White Division High Point title at Championships! There were a number of impressive podium performances to highlight.

Highland Lakes breaststrokers have impressed all season. In truth, it's historically been one of the team's best strokes year after year. 2024 was no different, with six HL swimmers earning top-3 finishes! The meet began with three impressive swims in a row. John Klimash set the tone finishing 3rd in the 8/U Boys event. HL followed up with two gold medal swims in a row with both Anabelle Schwarz and Landon Howes winning their events. A few events later, Alexa Fleming earned a bronze medal in the 11/12 Girls breaststroke. Adrienn Kovacs continued her unblemished breaststroke season winning gold in the 13/14 girls final. The breaststroke events concluded with a historic performance by Abbey Amato. Not only did she win the event by over a second - she broke the meet record in the 15/18 Girls event. Her final time of 34.55 is also a new team record! Highland Lakes has not had any representation on the "A" Champs meet records list since the mid-1990s! Congratulations Abbey on this amazing accomplishment. After a relatively quiet run in the butterfly events, HL backstrokers turned in a few medal-winning performances. Anabelle Schwarz took down her second medal of the meet with a bronze medal in the 8&Under Girls event. Way to go Anabelle! A few events later, Derek Fleming took home a silver medal in the 13/14 Boys backstroke with an impressive 36.41 swim.

Highland Lakes freestyle swimmers also managed a few top-3 finishes. First up, Derek Fisher swam to a bronze medal place in the 11/12 Boys free. Derek Fleming followed-up two events later with his second medal of the meet, this time a gold in the 13/14 Boys free. Go Derek!! The final medal-winning performance came in the relay events. The 13/14 girls, who have been one of our strongest age group squads all season, finished 3rd place in the medley relay event. Congratulations to Juliet Schwarz, Adrienn Kovacs, Alicia Kovacs, and Eva D. on their impressive swim.

Highland Lakes competed at "A" Championships with an impressive 60 swimmers this year, that's the most swimmers we've taken to "As" in my ten years as head coach. The HL Coaching staff were excited to claim the White Division High Point trophy for a third successive season. It was a fitting end to what has been a highly decorated season for the team. A very special thank you to my assistant coaches this season. Coach Catie Lovett is retiring after four years on the staff - special thanks to Coach Catie for an awesome run. She's been essential to the team these past few years. Coach Sofia Staley concluded her third season on the staff, I'm very happy to have her perspective and input on all things HL Swim Team. Finally, we were pleased to have Coach Michael Puccio join the staff this season. He's been a great addition to the coaching staff and has added a fresh perspective to the team.

With that, I'll sign-off for the 2024 season with a huge "thank you" to everyone involved in this wonderful 2024 edition of the Highland Lakes Swim Team. I am honored to be the custodian of this essential part of the Highland Lakes culture and grateful to everyone who has helped support in this endeavor. Have a great winter everyone, see you all next year!



A Special Thank You and Recognition

As the HL Sailing Coordinator, I would like to personally thank Abbey Amato on behalf of all the sailors and especially the Jr. Sunfish Fleet. Abbey chose the task of organizing our sailing shed for her Gold Award Project. The Gold Award is the highest award that a Senior Girl Scout can earn. Abbey had to identify an issue that was important to her, then develop and carry out an innovative and sustainable solution with measurable impact.

As an avid sailor most of her life at HL, Abbey knew our sailing shed was in desperate need of organization. It needed more than just a cleaning out. The sailing shed is used mainly by the Jr. Sunfish Fleet to house numerous rudders, centerboards, and other sailing parts for all the donated club boats that are used by juniors wanting to learn to sail, but not having a boat of their own. It is also used to store the race committee equipment used by all eight sailing fleets to start their races. After vetting through several different approaches that met her budget constraints, she came up with a creative concept that included building racks made of recycled materials.

For the first time ever, I was able to step into the shed without climbing over boat parts and other clutter. 

A Message Regarding Pontoon Boats

MARK BURUCHIAN, CHAIR, BOAT DOCK COMMITTEE

Pontoon Boat Owners:

The Club recently approved a change to the Rules and Regulations. Effective January 1, 2025, the Club shall require mechanically propelled boats desiring use of a Club controlled dock space (i.e., assigned numbered dock space) to be registered with the State of New Jersey in accordance with the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) requirements for all mechanically propelled boats. Proof of registration will be required for mechanically propelled boats (e.g., pontoon boats and other boats with electric motors) to be assigned a dock space next year via the Lottery. In addition, it is highly recommended that members with mechanically propelled boats complete the NJ approved Boating Safety Course and receive a boating

safety certificate issued by the MVC. Please note the NJ State Marine Police were recently at the lake and may have already issued tickets for any unregistered boats. We also ask all pontoon boat owners to be cognizant of how to properly secure their boats to the dock. The docks were a significant investment by the Club, and we want to ensure they remain in good condition. I've noticed a lot of the boats are not properly secured and are causing damage to the docks. Please be sure to tie your boat in such a way that it keeps the front edge of the pontoons from rubbing against the docks. This can be done by using the lines to pull the boat back and away from the dock as opposed to just pulling it sideways away from the stringers.
